# House Bill 2082

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for State Board of Licensed Social Workers)

#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates and modifies definitions related to social work. Moves language related to certain civil penalties to provision under which State Board of Licensed Social Workers has general regulatory authority. Modifies composition of board. Declares emergency, effective on passage. ORS 675.510 is amended to read: 675.510. As used in ORS 675.510 to 675.600, unless the context requires otherwise: 9 (1) "Authorization to practice regulated social work" means a certificate or license issued by 10 the State Board of Licensed Social Workers under ORS 675.510 to 675.600. 11 12 [(2) "Clinical social work" means the professional practice of applying principles and methods with individuals, couples, families, children and groups, which include, but are not restricted to:] 13 [(a) Providing diagnostic, preventive and treatment services of a psychosocial nature pertaining to 14 15personality adjustment, behavior problems, interpersonal dysfunctioning or deinstitutionalization;] 16 [(b) Developing a psychotherapeutic relationship to employ a series of problem solving techniques for the purpose of removing, modifying, or retarding disrupted patterns of behavior, and for promoting 17positive personality growth and development;] 18 19 [(c) Counseling and the use of psychotherapeutic techniques, such as disciplined interviewing which is supportive, directive or insight oriented depending upon diagnosed problems, observation and feed-20 21back, systematic analysis, and recommendations;] 22 [(d) Modifying internal and external conditions that affect a client's behavior, emotions, thinking, 23or intrapersonal processes;] 24 [(e) Explaining and interpreting the psychosocial dynamics of human behavior to facilitate problem 25solving; and] 26 [(f) Supervising, administering or teaching clinical social work practice.] 27(2) "Clinical social work" means: (a) A speciality within the practice of master's social work that requires the application 28 29 of specialized clinical knowledge and advanced clinical skills to the assessment, diagnosis or

1 treatment of mental, emotional or behavioral disorders or conditions, or as further defined

2 by the board by rule;

(b) The application of services described in paragraph (a) of this subsection to the pro vision of individual, marital, couples, family or group counseling or psychotherapy; or

5 (c) The clinical supervision, as defined by the board by rule, of services described in 6 paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection.

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(3) "Clinical social worker" means a person who practices clinical social work.

8 (4) "Practice of baccalaureate social work" means the basic, generalist practice of social 9 work that includes assessment, planning, intervention, evaluation, case management, infor-10 mation and referral, counseling, supervision, consultation, education, advocacy, community 11 organization, and the development, implementation and administration of policies, programs 12 or activities.

(5) "Practice of master's social work" means social work characterized by the application
of specialized knowledge and advanced practice skills in the areas of assessment, treatment
planning, implementation or evaluation, case management or referral, counseling, nonclinical
supervision, consultation, education, research, advocacy, community organization, or the
development, implementation or administration of policies, programs or activities.

(6) "Practice of social work" means the application of social work theory, knowledge,
 methods and ethics to restore or enhance social, psychosocial or biopsychosocial functioning
 of an individual, couples, families, children, groups, organizations or communities.

[(3)] (7) "Regulated social worker" means a baccalaureate social worker registered under ORS 675.532, a master's social worker licensed under ORS 675.533, a clinical social work associate certified under ORS 675.537 or a clinical social worker licensed under ORS 675.530.

[(4)] (8) "Unprofessional conduct" includes, but is not limited to, any conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the social work profession or any conduct that constitutes or might constitute a danger to the health or safety of a client or the public or in any other manner fails or might fail to adhere to the recognized standards of the profession.

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## PLACEMENT OF CIVIL PENALTY PROVISIONS

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31 <u>SECTION 2.</u> ORS 675.992 and 675.994 are repealed.

32 **SECTION 3.** ORS 675.540 is amended to read:

675.540. (1) The State Board of Licensed Social Workers may impose any or all of the sanctions
 specified in subsection (2) of this section, upon proof, after a hearing pursuant to the provisions of
 ORS chapter 183 relating to a contested case, that a regulated social worker:

36 (a) Has been convicted in this or any other state of a crime that is a felony in this state;

37 (b) Has been convicted of a felony in a federal court;

38 (c) Is unable to perform the practice of social work by reason of physical illness;

39 (d) Has an impairment as defined in ORS 676.303;

40 (e) Has been grossly negligent or has engaged in unprofessional conduct in the practice of social
 41 work; or

42 (f) Has violated any provision of ORS 675.510 to 675.600 or any rule adopted under ORS 675.600.

43 (2) Pursuant to the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, the board may:

(a) Deny, suspend, revoke or refuse to renew any authorization to practice regulated social work
 issued under ORS 675.510 to 675.600.

(b) Place a regulated social worker on probation and impose conditions or limits on the scope 1 2 of practice of a regulated social worker. 3 (c) Impose a civil penalty not to exceed \$3,000 for each violation. (3) The expiration, or voluntary surrender by a regulated social worker, of an authorization to 4 practice regulated social work does not deprive the board of jurisdiction to proceed with any in-5 vestigation of, or any action or disciplinary proceedings against, the regulated social worker. 6 (4) Information that the board obtains as part of an investigation into the conduct of a regulated 7 social worker or an applicant for an authorization to practice regulated social work or as part of 8 9 a contested case proceeding, consent order or stipulated agreement involving the conduct of a regulated social worker or applicant, is confidential as provided under ORS 676.175. 10 (5) Subject to the provisions of ORS chapter 183 relating to a contested case, the board may 11 12 impose a civil penalty in an amount up to \$5,000 upon proof that, after a person's authorization to 13 practice regulated social work has been revoked by the board, the person has: (a) Engaged in the practice of clinical social work; or 14 15(b) Represented that the person is a regulated social worker. 16 (6) Subject to the provisions of ORS chapter 183 relating to a contested case, the board may impose a civil penalty of up to \$3,000 upon proof that a person who is not a regulated 17 18 social worker has: (a) Represented that the person is a regulated social worker; or 19 (b) Used the title "social worker" or any title, words or abbreviations that indicate that 20the person has an authorization to practice regulated social work in violation of ORS 675.520. 2122(7) Subject to the provisions of ORS chapter 183 relating to a contested case, the board may impose a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 upon proof that a person who is not a clinical social 23worker licensed under ORS 675.530 or a clinical social work associate certified under ORS 24 25675.537 has: (a) Engaged in the practice of clinical social work, unless the person is permitted to 2627practice clinical social work under ORS 675.523; or (b) Represented that the person is a clinical social worker or clinical social work associ-2829ate. 30 31 **CHANGES TO BOARD COMPOSITION** 32SECTION 4. ORS 675.590 is amended to read: 33 34 675.590. (1) There is established a State Board of Licensed Social Workers. The board shall 35 consist of seven members appointed by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate in the manner provided in ORS 171.562 and 171.565. All members of the board must be residents of this 36 37 state. Of the members of the board: 38 (a) [Four] Three members shall be clinical social workers licensed under ORS 675.530; [and] (b) One member shall be a baccalaureate social worker registered under ORS 675.532, a 39 master's social worker licensed under ORS 675.533 or a clinical social work associate certified 40 under ORS 675.537; and 41 [(b)] (c) Three members [must] shall be members of the public who have demonstrated an in-42 terest in the field of clinical social work and who are not: 43 (A) Regulated social workers; or 44 (B) A spouse, domestic partner, child, parent or sibling of a regulated social worker. 45

1 (2)(a) Board members [required to be clinical social workers licensed under ORS 675.530] **ap-**2 **pointed under subsection (1)(a) and (b) of this section** may be appointed from a list of three to 3 five nominees for each vacancy, submitted by any professional organization that represents clinical

4 social workers.

5 (b) In selecting the members of the board, the Governor shall strive to balance the represen-6 tation on the board according to:

7 (A) Geographic areas of this state; and

8 (B) Ethnic group.

9 (3)(a) The term of office of each member is four years, but a member serves at the pleasure of 10 the Governor. The terms must be staggered so that no more than three terms end each year.

(b) Before the expiration of the term of a member, the Governor shall appoint a successor whose term begins on July 1 next following. A member is eligible for reappointment. If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become immediately effective for the unexpired term.

(c) A board member shall be removed immediately from the board if, during the member's term,the member:

17 (A) Is not a resident of this state;

(B) Has been absent from three consecutive board meetings, unless at least one absence is ex-cused; or

20 (C) Is not a clinical social worker licensed under ORS 675.530 or a retired clinical social worker 21 who was a clinical social worker licensed under ORS 675.530 in good standing at the time of re-22 tirement, if the board member was appointed to serve on the board as a clinical social worker li-23 censed under ORS 675.530.

(4) Members of the board are entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in ORS 292.495.
The board may provide by rule for compensation to board members for the performance of duties at a rate that is greater than the rate provided in ORS 292.495.

27 <u>SECTION 5.</u> The Governor shall appoint the member who is a baccalaureate social 28 worker, a master's social worker or a clinical social work associate, as required by the 29 amendments to ORS 675.590 (1) by section 4 of this 2013 Act, to the State Board of Licensed 30 Social Workers upon the first available vacancy on the board for a position held by a clinical 31 social worker after the operative date specified in section 10 of this 2013 Act.

(1) If an applicant for initial licensure [as a master's social worker] for the practice 5 of master's social work has complied with the requirements of this section and has paid the fee 6 under ORS 675.571, the State Board of Licensed Social Workers shall issue a license to the appli-7 cant. 8 9 (2) An applicant for licensure [as a master's social worker] for the practice of master's social work shall submit evidence satisfactory to the board that the applicant: 10 (a) Has complied with the requirements of all applicable provisions of ORS 675.510 to 675.600 11 12 and the applicable rules of the board; 13 (b) Holds a master's degree in social work from a college or university accredited by an accrediting organization recognized by the board; and 14 15 (c) If required under ORS 675.535, has passed the written examination for licensure [as a 16 master's social worker] for the practice of master's social work. SECTION 8. ORS 675.535 is amended to read: 17 18 675.535. (1) The State Board of Licensed Social Workers may adopt rules to establish written examination requirements for: 19 20(a) The practice of baccalaureate social [worker registration] work under ORS 675.532; 21(b) The practice of master's social [worker licensing] work under ORS 675.533; or 22(c) Clinical social [worker licensing] work licensure under ORS 675.530. (2) The rules adopted by the board under this section shall specify the subjects on which an 23applicant may be examined, how the written examination is to be administered and the scoring or 24evaluation process used to determine whether an applicant has passed the examination. The board 25shall provide a copy of the rules to an applicant at least 30 days prior to any examination. 2627(3) Examinations for authorizations to practice regulated social work conducted under ORS 675.510 to 675.600 shall be held at least once every year at such times and places as the board may 28determine. Timely and appropriate notice shall be sent to each applicant. 2930 (4) Upon written request to the board, any applicant may discuss the applicant's performance 31 on the examination with the board. (5) Any applicant who fails to attain a passing grade on the examination shall be allowed to take 32the examination a second time. Any applicant who fails the examination a second time must obtain 33 34 special permission from the board to take the examination again. SECTION 9. ORS 675.560 is amended to read: 35 675.560. (1) An authorization to practice regulated social work granted by the State Board of 36 37 Licensed Social Workers under ORS 675.510 to 675.600 is effective when the authorization is issued 38 by the board. 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15	SECTION 10. (1) The amendments to ORS 675.510, 675.532, 675.533, 675.535, 675.540, 675.560
16	and 675.590 by sections 1, 3, 4 and 6 to 9 of this 2013 Act and the repeal of ORS 675.992 and
17	675.994 by section 2 of this 2013 Act become operative on January 1, 2015.
18	(2) The State Board of Licensed Social Workers may take any action before the operative
19	date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the board to exer-
20	cise, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all the duties,
21	functions and powers conferred on the board by the amendments to ORS 675.510, 675.532,
22	675.533, 675.535, 675.540, 675.560 and 675.590 by sections 1, 3, 4 and 6 to 9 of this 2013 Act and

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33	SECTION 12. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
34	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
