House Bill 2127

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Health Care)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires contracting agency to base determination of contractor's responsibility for public improvement contract on contractor's demonstration that contractor provided health insurance to contractor's employees for period of two years before contractor submitted bid for public improvement contract.

Specifies exemptions for certain bidders. Becomes operative January 2, 2014.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to determinations of responsibility for contractors on public improvement contracts; creat-

3 ing new provisions; amending ORS 279C.375; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 279C.375 is amended to read:

6 279C.375. (1) After a contracting agency has opened bids and determined that the contracting

agency will award a public improvement contract, the contracting agency shall award the contract
to the lowest responsible bidder.

9 (2) At least seven days before awarding a public improvement contract, unless the contracting 10 agency determines that seven days is impractical under rules adopted under ORS 279A.065, the 11 contracting agency shall issue to each bidder or post, electronically or otherwise, a notice of the 12 contracting agency's intent to award a contract. This subsection does not apply to a contract to 13 which competitive bidding does not apply under ORS 279C.335 (1)(c) or (d). The notice and the 14 manner in which the **contracting agency posts or issues the** notice [*is posted or issued*] must 15 conform to rules adopted under ORS 279A.065.

(3) In determining the lowest responsible bidder, a contracting agency shall do all of the fol-lowing:

(a) Check the list created by the Construction Contractors Board under ORS 701.227 for bidders
who are not qualified to [*hold*] receive a public improvement contract.

20 (b) Determine whether the bidder is responsible. A responsible bidder must demonstrate to the 21 contracting agency that the bidder:

(A) Has available the appropriate financial, material, equipment, facility and personnel resources
and expertise, or has the ability to obtain the resources and expertise, necessary to meet all contractual responsibilities.

(B) Holds current licenses that businesses or service professionals operating in this state must
 hold in order to undertake or perform the work specified in the contract.

(C) Is covered by liability insurance and other insurance in amounts the contracting agency
 requires in the solicitation documents.

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1	(D) Qualifies as a carrier-insured employer or a self-insured employer under ORS 656.407 or has			
2	elected coverage under ORS 656.128.			
3	(E) Provided health insurance to the bidder's employees for a period of two years before			
4	the date on which the bidder submitted the bid for the public improvement contract. The			
5	requirement set forth in this subparagraph does not apply to a bidder that employs 25 or			
6	fewer employees or that has existed for less than two years before submitting the bid for the			
7	public improvement contract.			
8	[(E)] (F) [Has] Made the disclosure required under ORS 279C.370.			
9	[(F)] (G) Completed previous contracts of a similar nature with a satisfactory record of per-			
10	formance. For purposes of this subparagraph, a satisfactory record of performance means that to			
11	extent that the costs associated with and time available to perform a previous contract remained			
12	within the bidder's control, the bidder stayed within the time and budget allotted for the procure			
13	ment and otherwise performed the contract in a satisfactory manner. The contracting agency shall			
14	document the bidder's record of performance if the contracting agency finds under this subparagraph			
15	that the bidder is not responsible.			
16	[(G)] (H) Has a satisfactory record of integrity. The contracting agency in evaluating the			
17	bidder's record of integrity may consider, among other things, whether the bidder has previous			
18	criminal convictions for offenses related to obtaining or attempting to obtain a contract or subcon			
19	tract or in connection with the bidder's performance of a contract or subcontract. The contracting			
20	agency shall document the bidder's record of integrity if the contracting agency finds under this			
21	subparagraph that the bidder is not responsible.			
22	[(H)] (I) Is legally qualified to contract with the contracting agency.			
23	[(I)] (J) Supplied all necessary information in connection with the inquiry concerning responsi-			
24	bility. If a bidder fails to promptly supply information concerning responsibility that the contracting			
25	agency requests, the contracting agency shall determine the bidder's responsibility based on avail-			
26	able information, or may find that the bidder is not responsible.			
27	(c) Document the contracting agency's compliance with the requirements of paragraphs (a) and			
28	(b) of this subsection in substantially the following form:

16	(a) Promptly execute a formal contract; and		
17	(b) Execute and deliver to the contracting agency a performance bond and a payment bond when		
18	required under ORS 279C.380.		
19	(5) Based on competitive bids, a contracting agency may award a public improvement contract		
20	or may award multiple public improvement contracts when specified in the invitation to bid.		
21	(6) A contracting agency may not exclude a commercial contractor from competing for a public		
22	contract on the basis that the license issued by the Construction Contractors Board is endorsed as		
23	a level 1 or level 2 license. As used in this [section] subsection, "commercial contractor" has the		
24	meaning given that term in ORS 701.005.		
25	SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 279C.375 by section 1 of this 2013 Act apply to		
26	contracts that a contracting agency first advertises or otherwise solicits or, if the con-		
27	tracting agency does not advertise or solicit the contract, to a contract that the contracting		
28	agency first enters on or after the effective date of this 2013 Act.		
29	SECTION 3. (1) The amendments to ORS 279C.375 by section 1 of this 2013 Act become		
30	operative on January 2, 2014.		
31	(2) The Attorney General, the Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative		
32	Services, the Director of Transportation or a contracting agency that adopts rules under		
33	ORS 279A.065 may take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this		
34	section that is necessary for the Attorney General, the director or the contracting agency		
35	to exercise, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of		
36	the duties, functions and powers conferred on the Attorney General, the director or the		
37	contracting agency by the amendments to ORS 279C.375 by section 1 of this 2013 Act.		
38	SECTION 4. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public		
39	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect		
40	on its passage.		
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
