CHAPTER

AN ACT

Relating to persons holding appointive office in state government; amending ORS 236.140.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 236.140 is amended to read:

236.140. Any person holding an appointive office in any of the offices, departments or institutions of this state[,] shall hold the same for an indefinite term[,] not exceeding four years, or for the term specified for the office by law. [and] A person holding an appointive office shall at all times serve at the pleasure of and be subject to removal by the appointive power [which] that made the appointment unless a different standard for removal from the office is specified by law. The appointive power may in all cases appoint a successor.
