# House Bill 2392

Sponsored by Representative CLEM (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires membership of Youth Development Council to include representatives of county de-partments and boards of county commissioners. Requires council to assess county programs and services related to youth development and training, identify funds for community-based programs, establish equitable funding formulas and respond to local concerns and considerations as identified and reported on by representatives of county departments and boards of county commissioners.

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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the Youth Development Council; amending sections 21 and 26, chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2 2012. 3

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. Section 21, chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, is amended to read: 5

Sec. 21. (1) The Youth Development Council is established. The council shall function under 6

the direction and control of the Oregon Education Investment Board established by section 1, 7

chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011. 8

(2) The council is established for the purpose of assisting the board in overseeing a unified 9 10 system that provides services to school-age children through youth 20 years of age in a manner that supports academic success, reduces criminal involvement and is integrated, measurable and ac-11 12 countable.

13 (3) The council consists of no fewer than 15 members who are appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall ensure that membership of the council satisfies any federal requirements for mem-14 bership of a state advisory committee on juvenile justice, and shall include a minimum of three 15 representatives of county departments and boards of county commissioners from diverse 16 regions of this state and tribal representation in the membership of the council. When deter-17 mining whom to appoint to the council, the Governor shall ensure that each congressional 18 district of this state is represented by at least one member of the council. 19

#### (a) Prioritize funding for [prevention and intervention] services related to the prevention of and 21 intervention in: 22

(A) Gang violence and gang involvement[.]; and 23

(B) The criminogenic risk factors that lead to juvenile delinquency as supported by 24 25research-based science.

(b) Determine the availability of funding to support community-based youth development 26 27programs, services and initiatives with demonstrated outcomes.

28 (c) Establish an equitable formula for the distribution of funding identified in paragraph

(b) of this subsection to programs and services in all geographic areas of this state. 29

(d) As determined to be necessary or appropriate, enter into intergovernmental agree-30

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ments with regional or county entities to contract for youth development programs, services 1 2 and initiatives.
