AN ACT

Relating to photo red light; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 810.435.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 810.435 is amended to read:

810.435. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, photographs taken under ORS 810.434 may be submitted into evidence in a criminal trial, grand jury proceeding or other criminal proceeding for the purpose of proving or disproving a felony or a Class A misdemeanor. [administrative proceeding or other judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding only for the purpose of proving or disproving a violation of ORS 811.265.]

(2) Photographs taken under ORS 810.434 may not be used in any criminal proceeding relating to the prosecution of a violation as described in ORS 153.008, other than for the purpose of proving or disproving a violation of ORS 811.265.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 810.435 by section 1 of this 2013 Act apply to photographs taken on or after the effective date of this 2013 Act.
