SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs state education programs to submit specified information about number of students and number of licensed or registered teachers regularly assigned to students. Directs Department of Education to make information available to public and to Legislative Assembly.
