77th OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY--2013 Regular Session

House Bill 2833

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY (at the request of Oregon Law Commission)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Adopts Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act. Imposes criminal penalties for making false unsworn declarations.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 2 Relating to unsworn foreign declarations; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 162.055, 3 162.065 and 162.075. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4 SECTION 1. Short title. Sections 1 to 8 of this 2013 Act may be cited as the Uniform 5 6 **Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act.** 7 SECTION 2. Definitions. As used in sections 1 to 8 of this 2013 Act: 8 (1) "Boundaries of the United States" means the geographic boundaries of the United States, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands and any territory or insular possession 9 subject to the jurisdiction of the United States. 10 (2) "Law" includes the federal or a state Constitution, a federal or state statute, a judi-11 cial decision or order, a rule of court, an executive order and an administrative rule, regu-12 13lation or order. (3) "Record" means information that is inscribed on a tangible medium or that is stored 14 in an electronic or other medium and is retrievable in perceivable form. 15(4) "Sign" means, with present intent to authenticate or adopt a record: 16 17 (a) To execute or adopt a tangible symbol; or (b) To attach to or logically associate with the record an electronic symbol, sound or 18 19 process. (5) "State" means a state of the United States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the 20 21United States Virgin Islands or any territory or insular possession subject to the jurisdiction 22of the United States. (6) "Sworn declaration" means a declaration in a signed record given under oath. "Sworn 23 24 declaration" includes a sworn statement, verification, certificate and affidavit. 25(7) "Unsworn declaration" means a declaration in a signed record that is not given under 26 oath, but is given under penalty of perjury. 27SECTION 3. Applicability. (1) Sections 1 to 8 of this 2013 Act apply to an unsworn decla-28 ration by a declarant who at the time of making the declaration is physically located outside the boundaries of the United States whether or not the location is subject to the jurisdiction 29of the United States. 30 (2) Sections 1 to 8 of this 2013 Act do not apply to a declaration by a declarant who is 31

1 (1) "Benefit" means gain or advantage to the beneficiary or to a third person pursuant to the 2 desire or consent of the beneficiary.

3 (2) "Material" means that which could have affected the course or outcome of any proceeding 4 or transaction. Whether a false statement is "material" in a given factual situation is a question of 5 law.

6 (3) "Statement" means any representation of fact and includes a representation of opinion, belief 7 or other state of mind where the representation clearly relates to state of mind apart from or in 8 addition to any facts which are the subject of the representation.

9 (4) "Sworn statement" means any statement that attests to the truth of what is stated and that 10 is knowingly given under any form of oath or affirmation or by declaration under penalty of perjury 11 as described in ORCP 1 E.

(5) "Unsworn declaration" has the meaning given that term in section 2 of this 2013 Act.
 SECTION 10. ORS 162.065 is amended to read:

14 162.065. (1) A person commits the crime of perjury if the person makes a false sworn statement

15 **or a false unsworn declaration** in regard to a material issue, knowing it to be false.

16 (2) Perjury is a Class C felony.

17 **SECTION 11.** ORS 162.075 is amended to read:

18 162.075. (1) A person commits the crime of false swearing if the person makes a false sworn 19 statement **or a false unsworn declaration**, knowing it to be false.

20 (2) False swearing is a Class A misdemeanor.

21 <u>SECTION 12.</u> The section captions used in this 2013 Act are provided only for the con-22 venience of the reader and do not become part of the statutory law of this state or express 23 any legislative intent in the enactment of this 2013 Act.

24 <u>SECTION 13.</u> Sections 1 to 8 of this 2013 Act and the amendments to ORS 162.055, 162.065 25 and 162.075 by sections 9 to 11 of this 2013 Act apply to unsworn declarations made on or 26 after the effective date of this 2013 Act.
