

# House Bill 2896

Sponsored by Representative BUCKLEY, Senator JOHNSON, Representative JOHNSON; Representatives GREENLICK, HARKER, KENNEMER, Senators BATES, MONNES ANDERSON, STEINER HAYWARD

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Prohibits entity doing business in this state as tanning facility from allowing person who is under 18 years of age to use tanning device that is owned or operated by entity.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to tanning.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 453.726 to**  
5 **453.732.**

6 **SECTION 2. (1)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, an entity doing**  
7 **business in this state as a tanning facility may not allow a person who is under 18 years of**  
8 **age to use a tanning device that is owned or operated by the entity.**

9 **(b) An entity may allow a person who is under 18 years of age to use a tanning device**  
10 **that is owned or operated by the entity if:**

11 **(A) The person or the parent or legal guardian of the person provides the entity with**  
12 **documentation that a physician licensed under ORS chapter 677 has recommended that the**  
13 **person use a tanning device for a medical purpose; and**

14 **(B) The entity only allows the person to use a tanning device according to the terms of**  
15 **the physician's recommendation.**

16 **(2) An entity doing business in this state as a tanning facility shall post in conspicuous**  
17 **view notice of the prohibition described in subsection (1) of this section.**

18 **(3) The Oregon Health Authority shall adopt rules necessary to implement the provisions**  
19 **of this section.**
