(1)(a) Except as provided in paragraphs (b) and (c) of this subsection, an $\mathbf{5}$ entity doing business in this state as a tanning facility may not allow a person who is under 6 18 years of age to use a tanning device that is owned or operated by the entity. 7 "(b) An entity may allow a person who is under 17 years of age to use a tanning device that is owned or operated by the entity if: 8 9 "(A) The person or the parent or legal guardian of the person provides the entity with documentation that a physician licensed under ORS chapter 677 has recommended that the 10 11 person use a tanning device for a medical purpose; and 12"(B) The entity only allows the person to use a tanning device according to the terms 13 of the physician's recommendation. 14 "(c) An entity may allow a person who is 17 years of age to use a tanning device that is 15owned or operated by the entity if the person provides the entity with documentation that 16 the parent or legal guardian of the person has consented to the use. 17 "(2) Documentation required under subsection (1)(c) of this section: 18 "(a) Must verify the age of the person; "(b) Must verify the relationship between the person and the parent or legal guardian 19 who consented to the use: 20 21"(c) Is valid only for one year; and "(d) Must be presented to the entity each time that the person uses a tanning device 2223owned or operated by the entity. 24 "(3) An entity doing business in this state as a tanning facility shall post in conspicuous 25view notice of the prohibition described in subsection (1) of this section. 26 "(4) The Oregon Health Authority shall adopt rules necessary to implement the pro-27visions of this section.". 28
