House Bill 3230

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Clarifies duties and powers of Oregon Education Investment Board and Chief Education Officer. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

<u>SECTION 12.</u> (1) For the purpose of furthering the mission of the Oregon Education Investment Board to oversee a unified public education system, the Chief Education Officer shall have direction and control over the positions identified in subsection (2) of this section for matters related to the design and organization of the state's education system, including early childhood services provided by the state.

8 (2) The positions over which the Chief Education Officer shall have direction and control
9 are:

10 (a) The Commissioner for Community College Services.

11 (b) The Chancellor of the Oregon University System.

12 (c) The executive director of the Oregon Student Access Commission.

- 13 (d) The Early Childhood System Director.
- 14 (e) The executive director of the Higher Education Coordinating Commission.
- 15 (f) The Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction.

(3) The authority of the Chief Education Officer granted under subsection (1) of this
section does not include the authority to appoint or remove a person from a position identi fied in subsection (2) of this section.

(4) If a person in a position identified in subsection (2) of this section is appointed by an
entity other than the Governor, the Governor shall resolve any dispute between the Chief
Education Officer and the appointing authority of the person. The Governor's decision is
final.

(5) In addition to the positions identified in subsection (2) of this section and subject to
ORS chapter 240, the Chief Education Officer shall appoint all subordinate officers and employees, prescribe their duties and fix their compensation.
