House Bill 3244

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Increases age of runaway and homeless youth for whom Department of Human Services must recommend policies for system of services and support from 18 to 21 years.

2 Relating to support services for youth; amending ORS 417.799.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 417.799 is amended to read:

5 417.799. (1) The Department of Human Services is responsible for coordinating statewide plan-6 ning for delivery of services to runaway and homeless youth and their families.

7 (2) The department shall recommend policies that integrate a system of services and support for 8 runaway and homeless youth into the state's continuum of care for children **or youth** who are 0

(3) The department may work with the Juvenile Crime Prevention Advisory Committee, the
Employment Department, the Housing and Community Services Department, the Department of
Community Colleges and Workforce Development, the Department of Education and the Oregon
Youth Authority to develop a comprehensive and coordinated approach for services and support for
runaway and homeless youth and their families.

(4) In addition to the state agencies listed in subsection (3) of this section, the department shall include representatives of youth, nonprofit organizations and statewide coalitions related to runaway and homeless youth services and supports in the joint process described in subsection (3) of this section.

(5) The department may enter into and renew contracts with providers for the provision of ser vices to runaway and homeless youth and their families.
