SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Eliminates authority of Governor to appoint seven-member board of directors of mass transit district known as Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon. Establishes authority for 11-member board appointed by counties, City of Portland, Metro and Governor.]

Requires Secretary of State to conduct performance audit of Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to governance of Tri-Met; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Secretary of State shall conduct a performance audit, as defined in

5 ORS 297.070, of the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon, a mass

6 transit district established under ORS 267.010 to 267.390. In addition to the determinations

7 required in conducting a performance audit, the Secretary of State shall examine, report and

8 make recommendations regarding any significant issues identified by the audit in relation to

9 the governance of the district, including:

(a) The immediate and long-term operational structure, practices and functions of the
district;

- 12 (b) The transparency of district operations, practices and functions;
- 13 (c) The immediate and long-term fiscal condition of the district; and
- 14 (d) Compliance with state and federal laws generally.

15 (2) In addition to the reporting requirements of ORS 297.050 and 297.075, the Secretary 16 of State shall submit the audit report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner required

17 by ORS 192.245 on or before January 30, 2014.

18 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 19 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 20 on its passage.

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
