House Bill 3392

Sponsored by Representative HUFFMAN; Representative SPRENGER, Senator ROBLAN (at the request of Northwest Career Colleges Federation)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Changes name of Tuition Protection Fund to Tuition Protection Trust Fund. Establishes fund as trust fund.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to a fund for tuition protection; creating new provisions; amending ORS 345.017 and 3 345.110; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 345.110 is amended to read:

6 345.110. (1) The Tuition Protection **Trust** Fund is established separate and distinct from the 7 General Fund. Interest earned by the **trust** fund shall be credited to the **trust** fund. Proceeds of the 8 **trust** fund are continuously appropriated to the Department of Education to protect students when 9 a career school ceases to provide educational services and for administrative expenses incurred 10 under subsection [(5)] (6) of this section.

11 (2) The Tuition Protection Trust Fund is a trust fund established exclusively for the uses 12and purposes declared in this section. The State of Oregon declares that this state has no proprietary interest in the Tuition Protection Trust Fund and disclaims any right to claim 13 14 contributions made to the trust fund from sources other than the General Fund. The Legislative Assembly unambiguously expresses an intention to create a contractual obligation of 1516 this state to subscribe to use the moneys in the trust fund only for the purposes declared 17 in this section and commits to not transfer the moneys in the trust fund to any other fund 18 or account to be used for other purposes. This subsection does not impair the force or effect of any law of this state specifically authorizing the investment of moneys from the trust 19 20 fund.

[(2)] (3) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall maintain and administer the **Tuition Protection Trust** Fund, and the State Board of Education shall adopt by rule procedures governing the administration and maintenance of the **trust** fund, including requirements relating to contributions to and claims against the **trust** fund.

[(3)] (4) Each career school shall pay to the Tuition Protection **Trust** Fund an initial capitalization deposit in amounts and within time limits established by rule of the board. Thereafter, each school shall make installment payments based on a matrix adopted by rule of the board. In establishing the amount and frequency of payments, the board may consider the enrollment and financial condition of each school and such other factors as the board considers appropriate. The superintendent may deny, suspend or revoke the license of a school [*which*] **that** fails to make payments

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1 or fails to conform to other requirements of this section or rules adopted by the board under this 2 section.

3 [(4)] (5) The superintendent shall deposit moneys received under this section with the State
 4 Treasurer in the Tuition Protection Trust Fund.

5 [(5)] (6) The superintendent may disburse moneys from the **Tuition Protection Trust** Fund by 6 checks or orders drawn upon the State Treasurer in conformance with rules of the board and only 7 for tuition protection purposes, including the superintendent's costs in administering and maintain-8 ing the **trust** fund.

9 [(6)] (7) The superintendent may enter into contracts to carry out the purposes of the **Tuition** 10 **Protection Trust** Fund. The provisions of ORS 279.835 to 279.855 and ORS chapters 279A and 279B 11 do not apply to contracts entered into under this subsection.

12 <u>SECTION 2.</u> ORS 345.110, as amended by section 29, chapter 104, Oregon Laws 2012, is 13 amended to read:

14 345.110. (1) The Tuition Protection **Trust** Fund is established separate and distinct from the 15 General Fund. Interest earned by the **trust** fund shall be credited to the **trust** fund. Proceeds of the 16 **trust** fund are continuously appropriated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to 17 protect students when a career school ceases to provide educational services and for administrative 18 expenses incurred under subsection [(5)] (6) of this section.

19 (2) The Tuition Protection Trust Fund is a trust fund established exclusively for the uses and purposes declared in this section. The State of Oregon declares that this state has no 20proprietary interest in the Tuition Protection Trust Fund and disclaims any right to claim 2122contributions made to the trust fund from sources other than the General Fund. The Legis-23lative Assembly unambiguously expresses an intention to create a contractual obligation of this state to subscribe to use the moneys in the trust fund only for the purposes declared 2425in this section and commits to not transfer the moneys in the trust fund to any other fund or account to be used for other purposes. This subsection does not impair the force or effect 2627of any law of this state specifically authorizing the investment of moneys from the trust fund. 28

[(2)] (3) The commission shall maintain and administer the **Tuition Protection Trust** Fund and shall adopt by rule procedures governing the administration and maintenance of the **trust** fund, including requirements relating to contributions to and claims against the **trust** fund.

[(3)] (4) Each career school shall pay to the Tuition Protection Trust Fund an initial capital-32ization deposit in amounts and within time limits established by rule of the commission. Thereafter, 33 34 each school shall make installment payments based on a matrix adopted by rule of the commission. 35 In establishing the amount and frequency of payments, the commission may consider the enrollment and financial condition of each school and such other factors as the commission considers appro-36 37 priate. The commission may deny, suspend or revoke the license of a school [which] that fails to 38 make payments or fails to conform to other requirements of this section or rules adopted by the commission under this section. 39

40 [(4)] (5) The commission shall deposit moneys received under this section with the State Treas 41 urer in the Tuition Protection **Trust** Fund.

42 [(5)] (6) The commission may disburse moneys from the **Tuition Protection Trust** Fund by 43 checks or orders drawn upon the State Treasurer in conformance with rules of the commission and 44 only for tuition protection purposes, including the commission's costs in administering and main-45 taining the **trust** fund.

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[(6)] (7) The commission may enter into contracts to carry out the purposes of the **Tuition** 1 2 Protection Trust Fund. The provisions of ORS 279.835 to 279.855 and ORS chapters 279A and 279B do not apply to contracts entered into under this subsection. 3 SECTION 3. The amendments to ORS 345.110 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2013 Act apply 4 to moneys deposited in the Tuition Protection Trust Fund on or after the effective date of 5 this 2013 Act. 6 SECTION 4. 9 <u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
on its passage.

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
