SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Judicial Department for biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and reimbursements from federal service agreements, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department. Limits biennial expenditures by department from bond proceeds for payment of certain expenses. Limits biennial expenditures by department from federal funds. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Judicial Department for Oregon Law Commission, Council on Court Procedures, conciliation and mediation services in circuit courts and law libraries.

Decreases certain appropriations to Judicial Department.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Increases certain appropriations to Judicial Department. [Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2013.] Declares emergency, effective on passage.

5	SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Judicial Department, for the biennium begin-
6	ing July 1, 2013, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for the following purposes:

4 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 5 \$24,289,712 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for 6 payment of expenses for electronic court from bond proceeds collected or received by the 7 Judicial Department.

8 <u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 9 \$1,227,911 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for 10 payment of expenses from federal funds other than those described in section 2 of this 2013 11 Act collected or received by the Judicial Department.

12 <u>SECTION 5.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-13 ated to the Judicial Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, out of the General 14 Fund, the amount of \$224,582 for payment of expenses of the Oregon Law Commission.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri ated to the Judicial Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, out of the General
 Fund, the amount of \$52,000 for payment of expenses of the Council on Court Procedures.

18 <u>SECTION 7.</u> (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-19 priated to the Judicial Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, out of the Gen-20 eral Fund, the amount of \$7,212,384 for the purpose of providing conciliation and mediation 21 services in circuit courts.

(2) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall distribute the moneys appropriated un der this section to the counties of this state to fund conciliation and mediation services in
 circuit courts. The Chief Justice shall consult with the presiding judges of the circuit courts
 before making the distributions.

26 <u>SECTION 8.</u> (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-27 priated to the Judicial Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, out of the Gen-28 eral Fund, the amount of \$7,212,384 for the purpose of operating law libraries or providing 29 law library services.

(2) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall distribute the moneys appropriated un der this section to the counties of this state based on revenues received from filing fees
 collected during the 2009-2011 biennium in civil actions commenced in the circuit court for
 the county.

34 <u>SECTION 9.</u> (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri ation made to the Judicial Department by section 1 (2), chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2011, for
 the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, is decreased by \$1,162,469 for operations.

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to
 the Judicial Department by section 1 (3), chapter 634, Oregon Laws 2011, for the biennium
 beginning July 1, 2011, is increased by \$567,358 for mandated payments.

(3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to
the Judicial Department by section 15, chapter 600, Oregon Laws 2011, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, is increased by \$595,111 for third party debt collection fees.

43 <u>SECTION 10.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 44 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 45 on its passage. A-Eng. HB 5016
