House Memorial 1

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Urges Congress to enact legislation to modernize Toxic Substances Control Act.

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HOUSE MEMORIAL

2 To the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress as-3 sembled:

We, your memorialists, the House of Representatives of the State of Oregon, in legislative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:

6 Whereas American consumers deserve to have confidence that the products they buy, when used 7 for their intended purposes, are safe; and

8 Whereas a federal chemical management program should place protection of public health, in-9 cluding children's health, as its highest priority, and should include strict government oversight; and

Whereas a federal chemical management program should preserve the role of the United States as the world's leading innovator and employer in the manufacture, processing, commercial distrib-

12 ution and use of chemicals; and

Whereas the current chemical management law, the Toxic Substances Control Act (15 U.S.C.
2601 et seq.), was signed into law in 1976 and is now 37 years old; and

15 Whereas since the enactment of the Toxic Substances Control Act our ability to understand the 16 impact chemicals have on the human body and the environment has advanced significantly; and

17 Whereas advancements in science and technology need to be integrated into the federal chemi-18 cal management program; and

19 Whereas momentum for modernization of the federal chemical regulatory system is growing; and

20 Whereas a robust federal chemical management system will obviate the need for state govern-21 ments to adopt different and sometimes conflicting state regulatory programs that have the potential

22 for negative impacts on the national economy; now, therefore,

23 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Oregon:

(1) The Congress of the United States of America is respectfully requested to enact federal leg islation to modernize the Toxic Substances Control Act (15 U.S.C. 2601 et seq.). Amendments to the
 Toxic Substances Control Act should strengthen chemicals management to:

27 (a) Ensure that chemicals are safe for their intended use;

(b) Require the Environmental Protection Agency to systematically prioritize chemicals for the
 purpose of assessing their safe use;

30 (c) Require that the Environmental Protection Agency act expeditiously and efficiently in as-31 sessing the safe use of chemicals;

(d) Require companies that manufacture, import, process, distribute or use chemicals to provide 1 $\mathbf{2}$ the Environmental Protection Agency with relevant information to the extent necessary for the 3 agency to make safe use determinations; (e) Ensure that the potential risks to children from exposure to chemicals are considered in the 4 assessment of safe use; $\mathbf{5}$ (f) Empower the Environmental Protection Agency to impose a range of risk management con-6 trols to ensure that chemicals are safe for their intended use; 7 (g) Encourage companies and the Environmental Protection Agency to work together to enhance 8 9 public access to chemical health and safety information; (h) Require that the Environmental Protection Agency rely on scientifically valid data and in-10 formation, regardless of source, including data and information reflecting modern advances in sci-11 12 ence and technology; (i) Enable the Environmental Protection Agency to have the staff, resources and regulatory tools 13needed to ensure the safety of chemicals; and 14 15(j) Ensure that the Toxic Substances Control Act remains a vehicle to promote and encourage 16technological innovation and the maintenance of a globally competitive industry in the United States. 1718 (2) A copy of this memorial shall be sent to each member of the Oregon Congressional Delega-19 tion.

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
