Senate Bill 235

Sponsored by Senator HASS, Representative READ (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Transportation to issue Share the Road registration plates or Pacific Wonderland registration plates that recognize honorary consuls.

2	Relating to vehicle registration plates; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 805.117.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 805.117 is amended to read:

5 805.117. (1) As used in this section, "honorary consul" means a resident of Oregon who has been

duly appointed by a foreign country as an honorary consular officer to the United States, pursuant
to the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations.

8 (2) Upon application by an honorary consul who qualifies under this section, the Department

9 of Transportation shall issue consular corps registration plates for use on the motor vehicle of the 10 honorary consul.

(3) Registration plates issued under this section may be displayed on the vehicle of the honoraryconsul in lieu of regular registration plates issued under the vehicle code.

13 [(3)] (4) The following apply to registration plates issued under this section:

14 (a) The plates shall be considered customized plates for purposes of the fee in ORS 805.250.

15 (b) The plates shall be assigned to a specific vehicle.

16 (c) The plates may not be transferable from vehicle to vehicle, except as provided by the de-17 partment by rule.

(d) The plates shall be valid for the term in which the person is acting in the official capacity
of honorary consul for a foreign consulate. If the term of honorary consul continues into a new
registration period, the department may provide for validation of the plates for the subsequent term
by means of a sticker or by any other means the department determines convenient.

(e) The person to whom the plates are issued may retain the plates after the official term of honorary consul is over, but the plates may not be valid if displayed on any vehicle when the term of honorary consul has ended and the person is no longer appointed as an honorary consul.

(5)(a) In lieu of the consular corps registration plates issued under this section, upon
request of an honorary consul, the department shall issue Share the Road registration plates
as described in ORS 805.205, or Pacific Wonderland registration plates, as described in section 2, chapter 823, Oregon Laws 2009, that contain words or other marking that recognizes
the person's status as an honorary consul.

30 (b) Except as provided in paragraph (c) of this subsection, the requirements of this sec-31 tion apply to an honorary consul issued Share the Road registration plates or Pacific

1 Wonderland registration plates under this section.

2 (c) In addition to the fee described under subsection (4)(a) of this section, an honorary 3 consul issued:

4 (A) Share the Road registration plates shall pay the fee described in ORS 805.205.

5 (B) Pacific Wonderland registration plates shall pay the fee described in section 2, chap-6 ter 823, Oregon Laws 2009.

7 [(4)] (6) To qualify for consular corps registration plates, the person must provide the depart-

8 ment with proof that the person is appointed by a government as an honorary consul and is acting9 in that capacity.

10 [(5)] (7) The department shall adopt rules necessary to carry out the purposes of this section.

11 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 805.117 by section 1 of this 2013 Act apply to reg-12 istration plates issued on or after the effective date of this 2013 Act.
