Senate Bill 511

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires all vehicles to drive in right lane. Provides exceptions.

2	Relating to the offense of failure to keep a vehicle in the right lane; creating new provisions; and
3	amending ORS 811.325.
4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. ORS 811.325 is amended to read:
6	811.325. (1) A person commits the offense of failure to keep a [camper, trailer or truck] vehicle
7	in the right lane if the person is operating [any of the vehicles described in this subsection] a vehicle
8	and the person does not drive in the right lane of all roadways having two or more lanes for traffic
9	proceeding in a single direction. [This subsection applies to all of the following vehicles:]
10	[(a) Any camper.]
11	[(b) Any vehicle with a trailer.]
12	[(c) Any vehicle with a registration weight of 10,000 pounds or more.]
13	(2) This section does not require [the described vehicles] a vehicle to be driven in the right lane
14	under any of the following circumstances:
15	(a) When overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction under the
16	rules governing this movement in ORS 811.410 to 811.425 when such movement can be made without
17	interfering with the passage of other vehicles.
18	(b) When preparing to turn left.
19	(c) When reasonably necessary in response to emergency conditions.
20	(d) To avoid actual or potential traffic moving onto the right lane from an acceleration or
21	merging lane.
22	(e) When necessary to follow traffic control devices that direct use of a lane other than the right
23	lane.
24	(3) The offense described in this section, failure to keep [camper, trailer or truck] a vehicle in
25	the right lane, is a Class B traffic violation.
26	SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 811.325 by section 1 of this 2013 Act apply only to
27	violations of ORS 811.325 that occur on or after the effective date of this 2013 Act.
