Senate Bill 5535

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Post-Secondary Education for certain biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures of department from lottery moneys allocated from Administrative Services Economic Development Fund and Education Stability Fund.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by department. Limits biennial expenditures of department from federal funds.

Limits biennial expenditures of department from timber tax severance funds and Oregon Health and Science University Bond Fund. Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2013.
