## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Bans use of motors on Waldo Lake. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to Waldo Lake; amending ORS 830.180 and 830.185; and declaring an emergency.

## **3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 830.180 is amended to read:

5 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 6 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 7 on its passage.
