77th OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY--2013 Regular Session

Senate Bill 813

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Transfers responsibility for seismic rehabilitation grant program from Director of Office of Emergency Management to Oregon Department of Administrative Services. Becomes operative on January 1, 2014. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 2 Relating to public safety improvements to public buildings; creating new provisions; amending ORS 3 401.092 and 401.910; and declaring an emergency. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4 $\mathbf{5}$ SEISMIC REHABILITATION 6 7 8 SECTION 1. ORS 401.910 is amended to read: 9 401.910. (1) [The Director of the Office of Emergency Management, pursuant to the authority to 10 administer grant programs for seismic rehabilitation provided in ORS 401.092,] The Oregon De-11 partment of Administrative Services shall develop a grant program for the disbursement of funds 12for the seismic rehabilitation of critical public buildings, including hospital buildings with acute inpatient care facilities, fire stations, police stations, sheriffs' offices, other facilities used by state, 13 14 county, district or municipal law enforcement agencies and buildings with a capacity of 250 or more persons that are routinely used for student activities by kindergarten through grade 12 public 1516 schools, community colleges, education service districts and institutions of higher education. The 17 funds for the seismic rehabilitation of critical public buildings under the grant program are to be 18 provided from the issuance of bonds pursuant to the authority provided in Articles XI-M and XI-N of the Oregon Constitution. 19 20 (2) The grant program shall include the appointment of a grant committee. The grant committee 21may be composed of any number of persons with qualifications that the [director] department de-

termines necessary. However, the [*director*] **department** shall include persons with experience in administering state grant programs and representatives of entities with responsibility over critical public buildings. The [*director*] **department** shall also include as permanent members representatives of:

- 26 (a) The Department of Human Services;
- 27 (b) The State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries;
- 28 (c) The Seismic Safety Policy Advisory Commission;
- 29 (d) The [Oregon Department of Administrative Services] Office of Emergency Management;
- 30 (e) The Department of Education;

(f) The Oregon Health Authority; 1 2 (g) The Oregon Fire Chiefs Association; (h) The Oregon Association Chiefs of Police; and 3 (i) The Oregon Association of Hospitals and Health Systems. 4 (3) The [director] department shall determine the form and method of applying for grants from 5 the grant program, the eligibility requirements for grant applicants, and general terms and condi-6 tions of the grants. The [director] department shall also provide that the grant committee review 7 grant applications and make a determination of funding based on a scoring system that is directly 8 9 related to the statewide needs assessment performed by the State Department of Geology and Min-10 eral Industries. Additionally, the grant process may: (a) Require that the grant applicant provide matching funds for completion of any seismic re-11 12 habilitation project. 13 (b) Provide authority to the grant committee to waive requirements of the grant program based on special circumstances such as proximity to fault hazards, community value of the structure, 14 15 emergency functions provided by the structure and storage of hazardous materials. 16 (c) Allow an applicant to appeal any determination of grant funding to the [director] department for reevaluation. 17 18 (d) Provide that applicants release the state, the [director] department and the grant committee from any claims of liability for providing funding for seismic rehabilitation. 19 (e) Provide separate rules for funding rehabilitation of structural and nonstructural building el-2021ements. 22(4) Subject to the grant rules established by the [director] department and subject to reevalu-23ation by the [director] department, the grant committee has the responsibility to review and make determinations on grant applications under the grant program established pursuant to this section. 24 25SECTION 2. ORS 401.092 is amended to read: 401.092. (1) The Director of the Office of Emergency Management is responsible for coordinating 2627and facilitating exercises and training, emergency planning, preparedness, response, mitigation and recovery activities with the state and local emergency services agencies and organizations, and 28shall, with the approval of the Adjutant General or as directed by the Governor: 2930 (a) Make rules that are necessary and proper for the administration and implementation of this 31 chapter: (b) Coordinate the activities of all public and private organizations specifically related to pro-32viding emergency services within this state; 33 34 (c) Maintain a cooperative liaison with emergency management agencies and organizations of 35local governments, other states and the federal government; (d) Have such additional authority, duties and responsibilities authorized by this chapter or as 36 37 may be directed by the Governor; 38 (e) Administer grants relating to emergency program management under ORS 401.305, [seismic rehabilitation,] emergency services for the state and the statewide 2-1-1 system as provided in ORS 39 403.430; 40 (f) Provide for and staff a State Emergency Operations Center to aid the Governor and the Of-41 fice of Emergency Management in the performance of duties under this chapter; 42 (g) Serve as the Governor's authorized representative for coordination of certain response ac-43 tivities and managing the recovery process; 44

sonnel; 1 2 (i) Establish task forces and advisory groups to assist the office in achieving mandated responsibilities; 3 (j) Enforce compliance requirements of federal and state agencies for receiving funds and con-4 ducting designated emergency functions; 5 (k) Oversee the design, implementation and support of a statewide 2-1-1 system as provided un-6 der ORS 403.415; and 7 (L) Coordinate the activities of state and local governments to enable state and local govern-8 9 ments to work together during domestic incidents as provided in the National Incident Management System established by the Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 of February 28, 2003. 10 (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, the State Forester shall serve as the 11 12Governor's authorized representative for the purpose of initiating the fire management assistance 13 declaration process with the Federal Emergency Management Agency and administering Federal Emergency Management Agency fire management assistance grants. 14 15 16 TRANSFER 17 18 SECTION 3. The duties, functions and powers of the Director of the Office of Emergency Management relating to seismic rehabilitation of critical public buildings under the grant 19 program described in ORS 401.910 are imposed upon, transferred to and vested in the Oregon 20**Department of Administrative Services.** 212223**RECORDS, PROPERTY, EMPLOYEES** 94 SECTION 4. (1) The Director of the Office of Emergency Management shall: 25(a) Deliver to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services all records and property 2627within the jurisdiction of the director that relate to the duties, functions and powers transferred by section 3 of this 2013 Act; and 28(b) Transfer to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services those employees en-2930 gaged primarily in the exercise of the duties, functions and powers transferred by section 3 31 of this 2013 Act. (1) The unexpended balances of amounts authorized to be expended by the 44 Director of the Office of Emergency Management for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, 45

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from revenues dedicated, continuously appropriated, appropriated or otherwise made available for the purpose of administering and enforcing the duties, functions and powers transferred by section 3 of this 2013 Act are transferred to and are available for expenditure by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, for the purpose of administering and enforcing the duties, functions and powers transferred by section 3 of this 2013 Act.

7 (2) The expenditure classifications, if any, established by Acts authorizing or limiting 8 expenditures by the director remain applicable to expenditures by the department under this 9 section.

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ACTION, PROCEEDING, PROSECUTION

13 <u>SECTION 6.</u> The transfer of duties, functions and powers to the Oregon Department of 14 Administrative Services by section 3 of this 2013 Act does not affect any action, proceeding 15 or prosecution involving or with respect to such duties, functions and powers begun before 16 and pending at the time of the transfer, except that the department is substituted for the 17 Director of the Office of Emergency Management in the action, proceeding or prosecution.

LIABILITY, DUTY, OBLIGATION

SECTION 7. (1) Nothing in sections 3 to 9 of this 2013 Act and the amendments to ORS 401.092 and 401.910 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2013 Act relieves a person of a liability, duty or obligation accruing under or with respect to the duties, functions and powers transferred by section 3 of this 2013 Act. The Oregon Department of Administrative Services may undertake the collection or enforcement of any such liability, duty or obligation.

(2) The rights and obligations of the Director of the Office of Emergency Management legally incurred under contracts, leases and business transactions executed, entered into or begun before the operative date of section 3 of this 2013 Act accruing under or with respect to the duties, functions and powers transferred by section 3 of this 2013 Act are transferred to the department. For the purpose of succession to these rights and obligations, the department is a continuation of the director and not a new authority.

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RULES

35 <u>SECTION 8.</u> Notwithstanding the transfer of duties, functions and powers by section 3 36 of this 2013 Act, the rules of the Director of the Office of Emergency Management with re-37 spect to such duties, functions or powers that are in effect on the operative date of section 38 3 of this 2013 Act continue in effect until superseded or repealed by rules of the Oregon De-39 partment of Administrative Services. References in such rules of the director to the director 40 or the office or to an officer or employee of the office are considered to be references to the 41 department or to an officer or employee of the department.

42 <u>SECTION 9.</u> Whenever, in any uncodified law or resolution of the Legislative Assembly 43 or in any rule, document, record or proceeding authorized by the Legislative Assembly, in 44 the context of the duties, functions and powers transferred by section 3 of this 2013 Act, 45 reference is made to the Director of the Office of Emergency Management, to the office or

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1	to an officer or employee of the office, whose duties, functions or powers are transferred by
2	section 3 of this 2013 Act, the reference is considered to be a reference to the Oregon De-
3	partment of Administrative Services or to an officer or employee of the department who by
4	this 2013 Act is charged with carrying out such duties, functions and powers.

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8	SECTION 10. Sections 3 to 9 of this 2013 Act and the amendments to ORS 401.092 and
9	401.910 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2013 Act become operative on January 1, 2014.

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13	SECTION 11. The unit captions used in this 2013 Act are provided only for the conven-
14	ience of the reader and do not become part of the statutory law of this state or express any
15	legislative intent in the enactment of this 2013 Act.
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17	EMERGENCY CLAUSE
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19	SECTION 12. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
20	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
21	on its passage.

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
