

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2787**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 18 through 21 and insert:

2 “(d) Shows intention to become a citizen or a lawful permanent resident
3 of the United States by submitting to the public university the student at-
4 tends or plans to attend:

5 “(A) An official copy of the student’s application to register with a federal
6 immigration program or federal deportation deferral program or a statement
7 of intent that the student will seek to obtain citizenship as permitted under
8 federal law; and

9 “(B) An affidavit stating that the student has applied for a federal indi-
10 vidual taxpayer identification number.”.

11 On page 2, delete lines 7 through 11 and insert:

12 “(d) For a student who is not already a citizen or lawful permanent resi-
13 dent of the United States, shows intention to become a citizen or a lawful
14 permanent resident of the United States by submitting to the public univer-
15 sity the student attends or plans to attend:

16 “(A) An official copy of the student’s application to register with a federal
17 immigration program or federal deportation deferral program or a statement
18 of intent that the student will seek to obtain citizenship as permitted under
19 federal law; and

20 “(B) An affidavit stating that the student has applied for a federal indi-
21 vidual taxpayer identification number.”.

22 After line 14, insert:

“(4) A student who is a citizen or a lawful permanent resident of the United States and who has resided outside of Oregon for more than three years while serving in the Armed Forces of the United States, but who otherwise meets the requirements of subsection (1) or (2) of this section, shall qualify for exemption from nonresident tuition and fees for enrollment in a public university listed in ORS 352.002 without having to reestablish residency in Oregon.”.

In line 15, delete “(4)” and insert “(5)”.

After line 15, insert:

“(6) Not later than July 1 of each year, the Oregon University System shall report to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate and the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly with subject matter authority over higher education, for the preceding academic year:

“(a) The number of students that applied and were accepted into public universities under this section; and

“(b) The financial impact of this section on the Oregon University System.”.
