(1) As used in sections 2 and 3 of this 2013 Act, 'non-3 credit academic activity' means an academic activity offered by a 4 public university listed in ORS 352.002 for which academic credit is not 5 offered for participation. 'Noncredit academic activity' includes, but 6 is not limited to:

7 "(a) Auditing an academic course; or

"(b) Participating in a continuing education or community education program.

"(2) A public university listed in ORS 352.002 may not refuse a stu dent application to, or enrollment or participation in, any noncredit
 academic activity solely on the basis that the student:

"(a) Is a high school graduate who was not awarded a standard high
 school diploma or General Educational Development (GED) certificate;
 or

"(b) Has a modified or extended diploma as described in ORS 329.451.
"(3) A public university listed in ORS 352.002 may not adopt any
school policy with respect to a noncredit academic activity that treats
a student differently from other students of the university solely on
the basis that the student:

"(a) Is a high school graduate who was not awarded a standard high
 school diploma or General Educational Development (GED) certificate;

1 **or**

"(b) Has a modified or extended diploma as described in ORS 329.451.
"<u>SECTION 3.</u> Nothing in section 2 of this 2013 Act may be construed
to limit or otherwise prevent a public university listed in ORS 352.002
from:

6 "(1) Setting academic or other requirements to measure 7 preparedness or qualification to participate in a noncredit academic 8 activity;

9 "(2) Limiting the number of individuals who are not seeking aca10 demic credit from participating in an academic activity;

"(3) Granting credit-seeking students priority enrollment in an ac ademic activity before allowing noncredit-seeking students to enroll
 in the academic activity on a first-come, first-served basis; or

"(4) Limiting the types or number of courses in which individuals
 who are not seeking academic credit may participate.".

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
