

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 384**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, after line 3, insert:

2 **“SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part**
3 **of ORS chapter 689.”.**

4 In line 4, delete “1” and insert “2”.

5 Delete lines 5 and 6 and insert:

6 “(a) ‘Opiate’ means a narcotic drug that contains:

7 “(A) Opium;

8 “(B) Any chemical derivative of opium; or

9 “(C) Any synthetic or semisynthetic drug with opium-like effects.”.

10 In line 12, after “overdose” insert a period and delete the rest of the line
11 and delete line 13.

12 In line 14, after “must” delete the rest of the line and insert “specify:”.

13 Delete line 15.

14 In line 16, delete “(b)” and insert “(a)”.

15 In line 17, delete “(c)” and insert “(b)” and after “training” insert a
16 comma.

17 In line 25, delete “meeting” and insert “that meets”.

18 In line 26, before “may” insert “must be subject to oversight by a licensed
19 physician or certified nurse practitioner and” and after “authorities” delete
20 the rest of the line and delete lines 27 through 30 and insert “, organizations
21 or other appropriate entities that provide services to individuals who take
22 opiates.”.

1 On page 2, delete lines 1 through 4 and insert:

2 “(4) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a pharmacy, a health
3 care professional with prescription and dispensing privileges or any other
4 person designated by the State Board of Pharmacy by rule may distribute
5 unit-of-use packages of naloxone, and the necessary medical supplies to ad-
6 minister the naloxone, to a person who:

7 “(a) Conducts training that meets the protocols and criteria established
8 by the authority under subsection (2) of this section, so that the person may
9 possess and distribute naloxone and necessary medical supplies to persons
10 who successfully complete the training; or

11 “(b) Has successfully completed training that meets the protocols and
12 criteria established by the authority under subsection (2) of this section, so
13 that the person may possess and administer naloxone to any individual who
14 appears to be experiencing an opiate overdose.”.

15 In line 9, delete “2” and insert “3”.

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
