

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
SENATE BILL 850**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “offenses” insert “; creating new pro-  
2 visions; and amending ORS 811.111”.

3 After line 23, insert:

4 **“SECTION 3.** ORS 811.111 is amended to read:

5 “811.111. (1) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the  
6 person:

7 “(a) Drives a vehicle on an interstate highway at a speed greater than  
8 [65] **70** miles per hour or, if a different speed is posted under ORS 810.180 (3),  
9 at a speed greater than the posted speed.

10 “(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, drives any of the  
11 following vehicles at a speed greater than 55 miles per hour on any highway  
12 **other than an interstate highway, at a speed greater than 60 miles per**  
13 **hour on an interstate highway** or, if a different speed is posted under ORS  
14 810.180 (3), at a speed greater than the posted speed:

15 “(A) A motor truck with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 10,000  
16 pounds or a truck tractor with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than  
17 8,000 pounds.

18 “(B) A school bus.

19 “(C) A school activity vehicle.

20 “(D) A worker transport bus.

21 “(E) A bus operated for transporting children to and from church or an  
22 activity or function authorized by a church.

1 “(F) Any vehicle used in the transportation of persons for hire by a  
2 nonprofit entity as provided in ORS 825.017 (9).

3 “(c) Drives a vehicle or conveyance on any part of the ocean shore in this  
4 state at a speed greater than any of the following:

5 “(A) Any designated speed for ocean shores that is established and posted  
6 under ORS 810.180.

7 “(B) If no designated speed is posted under ORS 810.180, 25 miles per  
8 hour.

9 “(d) Drives a vehicle upon a highway in any city at a speed greater than  
10 a speed posted by authority granted under ORS 810.180 or, if no speed is  
11 posted, the following:

12 “(A) Fifteen miles per hour when driving on an alley or a narrow resi-  
13 dential roadway.

14 “(B) Twenty miles per hour in a business district.

15 “(C) Twenty-five miles per hour in a public park.

16 “(D) Twenty-five miles per hour on a highway in a residence district if  
17 the highway is not an arterial highway.

18 “(E) [*Sixty-five*] **Seventy** miles per hour on an interstate highway.

19 “(F) Fifty-five miles per hour in locations not otherwise described in this  
20 paragraph.

21 “(e) Drives a vehicle in a school zone at a speed greater than 20 miles  
22 per hour if the school zone is:

23 “(A) A segment of highway described in ORS 801.462 (1)(a) and:

24 “(i) The school zone has a flashing light used as a traffic control device  
25 and operated under ORS 810.243 and the flashing light indicates that chil-  
26 dren may be arriving at or leaving school; or

27 “(ii) If the school zone does not have a flashing light used as a traffic  
28 control device, the person drives in the school zone between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.  
29 on a day when school is in session.

30 “(B) A crosswalk described in ORS 801.462 (1)(b) and:

1       “(i) A flashing light used as a traffic control device and operated under  
2       ORS 810.243 indicates that children may be arriving at or leaving school; or

3       “(ii) Children are present, as described in ORS 811.124.

4       “(2) The offense described in this section, violating a speed limit, is  
5       punishable as provided in ORS 811.109.

6       “**SECTION 4. The amendments to ORS 811.111 by section 3 of this**  
7       **2013 Act apply to offenses committed on or after the effective date of**  
8       **this 2013 Act.”.**
