4 "<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) As used in this section:

5 "(a) 'Declared state of emergency' means:

"(A) A major disaster, as defined in 42 U.S.C. 5122 (2), declared by
the President of the United States;

8 "(B) A state of emergency declared by the Governor under ORS
9 401.165; or

"(C) A state of emergency declared by a city or county under ORS
401.309.

"(b) 'Emergency services' has the meaning given that term in ORS
 401.025.

"(c) 'Generator drop' means a mechanism that allows emergency services providers to switch fuel dispensing devices from the usual power source to a generator or other alternative power source so that the devices may be operated during a declared state of emergency.

"(d) 'Motor vehicle' has the meaning given that term in ORS
801.360.

"(2) Subject to subsection (3) of this section, each motor vehicle fuel
 dispensing device at a filling station, service station, garage, nonretail
 facility or other dispensary of Class 1 flammable liquids or diesel fuel

must be linked to a generator drop. The State Fire Marshal shall adopt rules establishing the minimum requirements for a generator drop. The rules may include, but need not be limited to, requirements for generator drops to have standardized fittings for connecting to alternative power sources and for generator drops to meet minimum performance standards.

"(3) Subsection (2) of this section applies to a filling station, service station, garage, nonretail facility or other dispensary that undergoes fuel dispensing system construction or renovation commencing on or after January 1, 2014. For purposes of this subsection, 'construction or renovation' means the installation, replacement or substantial repair of underground tanks, fuel supply lines, fuel dispensing devices and other equipment as set forth by the State Fire Marshal by rule.

"(4) When adopting or amending rules under this section, the State
 Fire Marshal shall consult with the Department of Consumer and
 Business Services, the State Department of Energy and the Office of
 Emergency Management.".

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
