SUMMARY

Increases age of youth for whom Youth Development Council may oversee unified system of services from 20 years to 24 years.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the Youth Development Council; amending ORS 417.847 and
3 417.852.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 417.847 is amended to read:

417.847. (1) The Youth Development Council is established. The council
shall function under the direction and control of the Oregon Education Investment Board established by section 1, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011.

9 (2) The council is established for the purpose of assisting the board in 10 overseeing a unified system that provides services to school-age children 11 through youth [20] **24** years of age in a manner that supports educational 12 success, focuses on crime prevention, reduces high risk behaviors and is in-13 tegrated, measurable and accountable. The council shall provide direction to 14 the Youth Development Division.

(3) The council consists of no fewer than 15 members who are appointed
by the Governor. The Governor shall ensure that membership of the council
satisfies any federal requirements for membership of a state advisory committee on juvenile justice.

(a) Determine the availability of funding to support community-basedyouth development programs, services and initiatives with demonstrated
