OPAL-K Mission Statement

The mission of OPAL-K is to expand the availability of timely, high-quality mental health treatment to youth in Oregon through support of the patient-centered medical home.



OPAL-K History

The Oregon Psychiatric Access Line about Kids arose out of collaboration between the Oregon Pediatric Society (OPS) and the Oregon Council of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry (OCCAP), which began in 2006. At that time, both groups recognized the need for better mental health access in the medical home.



OPAL-K History, continued...

- The 2013 legislature authorized new investments in children's mental health (under the advice of Addictions and Mental Health), including pilot funding for OPAL K
- OHSU developed the program over a period of six months and began taking calls in May 2014 through a pilot with COPA in Bend, and launching statewide in June 2014

Goals of OPAL-K

- Improve child psychiatry access for primary care providers and create opportunities for mentoring, education and consultation
- Create a service that is blind to insurance and provides care for all youth in Oregon
- Improve access to children's mental health services in primary care medical homes, school based settings and public health programs



Presently, OPAL-K...

- Provides same-day psychiatric phone consultation to primary care providers
- Utilizes evidence-based and informed guidelines
- Is focused on understanding and supporting youth from a biopsychosocial perspective
- Intends to improve ACCESS to high QUALITY identification and treatment of psychiatric and developmental challenges, thereby improving the EXPERIENCE of youth and their family

OPAL-K Vision

- Start with phone consultations
- Add face-to-face evaluations
- Add telemedicine evaluations
- PCP CME for Child Psychiatry Education
- Add care coordination and referral services
- Include community child mental health capacity building projects
 - Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes (ECHO) Project



Desired/Accomplished OPAL-K outcomes

- Supporting the Triple AIM
- Improve appropriate prescribing practices (with the potential of reduced pharmacy costs)
- Facilitate physical and behavioral health integration
- Promote a comprehensive approach to understanding youth that is trauma-informed, looks for strengths, and focuses on the whole child and system



Additional Potential Services

- Improving appropriate use of psychotropic medications for youth in foster care
 - Reviewing AMH dashboard reports
 - Consulting with outlier cases, providers
- Providing telemedical assessments
- Providing consultation to teams in mental health clinics
