SUMMARY

Provides that requirement for bidder or proposer to submit signed affidavit to demonstrate compliance with state tax laws when responding to solicitation for public contract does not apply to bidder or proposer that submits bid or proposal to local contracting agency.

Becomes operative 91 days after effective date of Act. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2 Relating to a requirement in a public procurement to submit a signed affi-

3 davit to demonstrate compliance with the tax laws of the state; creating

4 new provisions; amending ORS 279B.110; and declaring an emergency.

5 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

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6 **SECTION 1.** ORS 279B.110, as amended by section 3, chapter 77, Oregon 7 Laws 2014, is amended to read:

8 279B.110. (1) As part of a contracting agency's evaluation of a bid or 9 proposal, the contracting agency shall determine whether the bidder or 10 proposer is responsible in accordance with the standards of responsibility set 11 forth in subsection (2) of this section. If the contracting agency determines 12 that a bidder or proposer is not responsible, the contracting agency shall 13 provide the bidder or proposer with written notice of the contracting 14 agency's determination.

15 (2) In order for a contracting agency to determine that a bidder or 16 proposer is responsible, the bidder or proposer must demonstrate to the 17 contracting agency that the bidder or proposer:

18 (a) Has available the appropriate financial, material, equipment, facility

and personnel resources and expertise, or has the ability to obtain the re sources and expertise, necessary to meet all contractual responsibilities.

(b) Completed previous contracts of a similar nature with a satisfactory 3 record of performance. For purposes of this paragraph, a satisfactory record 4 of performance means that to the extent that the costs associated with and 5time available to perform a previous contract remained within the bidder's 6 or proposer's control, the bidder or proposer stayed within the time and 7 budget allotted for the procurement and otherwise performed the contract in 8 a satisfactory manner. The contracting agency shall document the bidder's 9 or proposer's record of performance if the contracting agency finds under 10 this paragraph that the bidder or proposer is not responsible. 11

12 (c) Has a satisfactory record of integrity. The contracting agency in evaluating the bidder's or proposer's record of integrity may consider, among 13 other things, whether the bidder or proposer has previous criminal con-14 victions for offenses related to obtaining or attempting to obtain a contract 15 or subcontract or in connection with the bidder's or proposer's performance 16 of a contract or subcontract. The contracting agency shall document the 17 bidder's or proposer's record of integrity if the contracting agency finds un-18 der this paragraph that the bidder or proposer is not responsible. 19

20 (d) Is legally qualified to contract with the contracting agency.

(e)(**A**) Complied with the tax laws of [*this*] **the** state or a political subdivision of [*this*] **the** state, including ORS 305.620 and ORS chapters 316, 317 and 318. The bidder or proposer shall demonstrate compliance by submitting a signed affidavit that attests, under penalty of perjury, that the bidder or proposer has complied with the tax laws of [*this*] **the** state or a political subdivision of [*this*] **the** state.

(B) The requirement under subparagraph (A) of this paragraph to submit a signed affidavit does not apply to a bidder or proposer that submits a bid or proposal to a local contracting agency.

30 (f) Supplied all necessary information in connection with the inquiry 31 concerning responsibility. If a bidder or proposer fails to promptly supply

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information concerning responsibility that the contracting agency requests,
the contracting agency shall determine the bidder's or proposer's responsibility based on available information or may find that the bidder or proposer
is not responsible.

5 (g) Was not debarred by the contracting agency under ORS 279B.130.

6 (3) A contracting agency may refuse to disclose outside of the contracting 7 agency confidential information [*furnished by*] **that** a bidder or proposer 8 **provided** under this section [*when*] **if** the bidder or proposer has clearly 9 identified in writing the information the bidder or proposer seeks to have 10 treated as confidential and the contracting agency has authority under ORS 11 192.410 to 192.505 to withhold the identified information from disclosure.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 279B.110 by section 1 of this 2015 Act apply to procurements that a contracting agency first advertises or otherwise solicits or, if the contracting agency does not advertise or solicit the procurement, to public contracts that the contracting agency enters into on or after the operative date specified in section 3 of this 2015 Act.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) The amendments to ORS 279B.110 by section 1 of
 this 2015 Act become operative 91 days after the effective date of this
 2015 Act.

21(2) The Attorney General, the Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, the Director of Transportation or a con-22tracting agency that adopts rules under ORS 279A.065 may take any 23action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this sec-24tion that is necessary to enable the Attorney General, the director or 25the contracting agency to exercise, on and after the operative date 26specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions 27and powers conferred on the Attorney General, the director or the 28contracting agency by the amendments to ORS 279B.110 by section 1 29of this 2015 Act. 30

31 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate pres-

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1 ervation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is de-

2 clared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
