# **Oregon Smoking Prevalence**

According the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), smoking prevalence in Oregon is less than the average for the rest of the country.

- 17.3 percent of Oregon adults smoke
  - 18.7 percent of males smoke
  - 16 percent of females smoke
- 19 percent of U.S. adults smoke

A 2011 study by the CDC showed that workers in mining, food services and construction had smoking prevalence rates that were more than double the rates found in professional services such as public administration, finance, management and education.<sup>[1]</sup>
