Chair McKeown and Committee Members,

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to testify in support of HB 2389 regarding roadside memorial signs. In 2011, the legislature passed HB 3039, which created the roadside memorial program for fallen law enforcement officers. Since 2011, the legislature has passed 14 concurrent resolutions, allowing families to install a highway memorial sign in honor of those killed in the line of duty. On February 25<sup>th</sup>, the House will vote on two more concurrent resolutions, honoring two fallen police officers.

HB 2389 mirrors HB 3039 in that it creates a fallen hero roadside memorial program for fallen soldiers. This is a simple program and a small way to honor those who have sacrificed their lives for serving our country.
