WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Prohibits the use of expulsion to address truancy. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

BACKGROUND: HB 2192-B (2013) established requirements for school policies related to discipline, suspension, and expulsion. While HB 2192-B limited expulsions, ORS 339.250 currently allows expulsion as a disciplinary measure to address truancy.

Senate Bill 556 amends ORS 339.250 to prohibit the use of expulsion to address truancy.
