Investments

- Restore the delivery of services that provide compensation to victims of violent crime
 - × Victims Assistance Program (VAP)
 - × Attorney General's Sexual Assault task force
 - × Sexual Assault Victim Emergency Fund
- Defense of the Master Settlement Agreement, tobacco revenue
- Support ongoing development of the Child Support Enforcement Automated System project (CSEAS)

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Investments (continued)

- Support the Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants (DUII) Resource Prosecutor Program
- Support efforts to provide necessary resources for the increasing number of cases and the complexity of cases being filed against the State of Oregon

Charitable Fees

- Supports Charitable Activities Section within the Civil Enforcement Division
- New sliding scale fee proposes to cover program costs and are consistent with statutory provisions.
- o First fee increase since 1981, effective January 1, 2016

Department of Justice 2015-17 Governor's Budget/ Co-Chairs' Framework

- Two major differences between Governor's Budget and Co-Charis' Framework
 - o Co-Chairs' Framework does not include:
 - \$0.2 million General Fund for the Defense of the Master Settlement Agreement tobacco revenues
 - * \$15.4 million Other Funds and \$30.0 million Federal Funds for capital construction; \$2.1 million General Fund for debt services for phase II of the Child Support Enforcement Automated System (CSEAS) project
