Amtrak Cascades Legislative Brief

The Service

The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) partners with Washington State's Department of Transportation (WSDOT) and Amtrak to provide the Amtrak Cascades service from Eugene to Vancouver, British Columbia via Portland and Seattle. Two roundtrip trains each day serve Eugene, Albany, Salem, Oregon City and Portland. Four roundtrips a day connect Portland and Seattle, with two daily roundtrips between Seattle and Vancouver, B.C. In Oregon, buses supplement the train service by connecting with trains running between Portland and Seattle. Amtrak Cascades is one of the nation's highest ridership passenger rail services, with 215,096 people using Amtrak Cascades trains and supporting buses between Eugene and Portland in 2013. Ridership in the Amtrak Cascades Corridor

(Corridor) has steadily increased since the service began in 1994, with 2013's total representing a 45.3 percent increase since 2007 and a 255 percent increase since 1995.

Benefits

Passenger rail provides an option for many travelers and has significant benefits.
