HOW THIS PROPOSAL WILL HELP OREGON'S CHILDREN

• this legislation would begin building a preschool system that aligns with Head Start but also allows for a mix of other providers;

• it would set quality standards so that no matter where children attend parents know their children are well cared for,

OREGON IS LAGGING IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

• Oregon ranks in the bottom quarter nationally for access to state-funded preschool for 3- and 4-year-olds.

• Seventy-two percent of 3- and 4-year-olds from low-income Oregon families – about 32,000 children from those families – don't have access to high-quality preschool.

HIGH-QUALITY PRESCHOOL WORKS

•It helps to close the achievement gap and gets children ready for kindergarten and on track for third-grade success.

• There is no greater return on investment in education than early learning. Research shows preschool provides benefits to society of roughly \$8.60 for every \$1 spent.
