As an attorney and former city council member in Newberg, I have been very concerned by the rate at which our prized Oregon farmland is being covered up or destroyed. This is not a new problem but a problem against which we should remain vigilant. This means we must both protect our current laws in place to limit urban growth onto farmland, and resist new laws enabling or encouraging harmful development such as aggregate mining.

The thing that makes our farmland so valuable is the layer of topsoil laid down over thens of thousands of years. Once this layer is removed or destroyed, we are left with river rocks and stones that more useful for decoration and landscaping than for farming. This is not a practice that should be encouraged and even when it is allowed we must maintain strict oversight of the potential harms that may result both to the land and to neighboring landowners.
