To the House Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee, respectfully:

I'm absolutely baffled why the progressive state of Oregon is considering a bill (HB3515) to prevent gray wolves from ever being included on the state's list of threatened or endangered species? This sounds as draconian a position as 2 unrelated bills being circulated in Congress that essentially advocate the same position!

Wolves are probably the most studied large predator in North America, if not the world. Science has proven time and time again through rigorous research that wolves are essential to maintaining a healthy ecosystem, which includes ungulate herds and songbirds as well as understory plants and water conservation. To NOT safeguard your wolf population from indiscriminate trophy hunting and poaching would be a crime. Wolves now only occupy 5% of their original US distribution since being wiped out by the early 1920's due to excessive hunting, trapping, and government contract killers.
