I am writing you to respectfully protest against HB 3515 and any other future bill that would limit protection for the Gray Wolf in Oregon in any way. These animals have not yet recovered and need continued protection!

With only about 77 wolves in the wild in Oregon, you cannot conclude that the population has recovered and with the majority of the wolves residing in the Eastern part of the state, these animals need continued protection to be able to establish themselves in other parts of the state and to become a diversified and sustainable population. There is sufficient habitat in Oregon to sustain a population of at least 300-500 wolves.

If the way the wolves are treated without protection in neighboring states such as Idaho and Montana is not enough example (hunted and trapped), Oregon should learn that we simply cannot turn our back on this majestic animal. If protection would be stripped, it will most certainly be a death warrant for this animal. In addition, this bill wants to prevent future protection as well.
