Dear Chairs Dembrow and Holvey and Committee Members,

I am the co-owner of Sublimity Snow & Skate in Beaverton and a member of The Main Street Alliance of Oregon. I, and The Main Street Alliance of Oregon, support raising the Oregon minimum wage.

Raising the minimum wage would benefit our community. If people are paid in a manner that keeps up with the cost of living, they are able to afford their basic needs and have a little more room in their budget to spend on the things they love—like skateboarding and snowboarding.

Many of our customers earn minimum wage. A minimum wage increase would allow them to afford a new pair of skate shoes after they have destroyed an old pair, and still be able to pay their electric bill or car payment. That's a positive thing for the whole community! It means minimum wage workers can afford the basics while having a little more money to spend locally. That's good for me and for other small businesses on our street!

Creating more income for others, creates more income for us. It's a beneficial relationship for everyone. I believe increased wages will not only benefit workers but will also benefit businesses' bottom line. It will result in customers being able to spend more money within the local economy.

The companies generally behind the argument to keep a low minimum wage are not companies concerned with local communities' best interests. It's usually larger corporations that have a vested interest in keeping the minimum wage low in order to preserve shareholder profits. Larger corporations like Walmart are currently changing their stance on this issue, and starting to champion a (slightly) higher minimum wage. They are starting to see that their workers can't afford to shop with them and pay their bills. That says something.

I would recommend all small businesses support raising the minimum wage; it's a positive thing. Let's do it! It's worked other places, and it will work here.
