We believe to simply extend term limits without implementing other requirement's of over-site, in essence will just continue a pattern of poor administrative over-site as the associated exhibit record to HB-3187 clearly identifies.

With that and as a point of record, Blind Employment Services of Tomorrow-(BEST), will be working collaboratively with the "stakeholders" of the Oregon Commission for the Blind to introduce legislation that provides a much more comprehensive approach to "addressing" the documented pattern of failed over-site by the Oregon Commission for the Blind in 2016.
