The Oregon Commission on Hispanic Affairs (OCHA) strongly supports HB 3304A as an important connection to the industry for Latino Oregonians pursuing professional landscaping licenses.

We believe that HB 3304A adds needed pathways for many highly skilled Latino Oregonians into the landscaping industry. For those wishing to apply their extensive agricultural skills in running a licensed landscaping business, this bill provides the necessary means to access training and prove their credentials in exams or field tests. While Spanish language exams are an important addition to help Oregon capture the skills of many Latinos for the landscaping industry, field tests open the industry to many more indigenous people and others whose primary language is not Spanish but who are expert in many aspects of landscaping and planting.
