Testimony in Support of HB 2317 Submitted to the Senate Judiciary Committee May 27, 2015

Chair Prozanski, Vice Chair Kruse, and members of the Senate Judiciary Committee,

The Oregon Coalition Against Domestic and Sexual Violence (OCADSV) and the Oregon Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force (AGSATF) write this letter in support of HB 2317, which would increase the statute of limitations to victims of certain sex crimes.

The mission of OCADSV is to promote equity and social change in order to end violence for all communities. We seek to transform society by engaging diverse voices, supporting the self-determination of survivors and providing leadership for advocacy efforts.

The mission of the AGSATF is to facilitate and support a victim-centered approach to the prevention of and response to sexual violence through multi-disciplinary collaboration.
