Online Application System



• Going "live" for applications: <u>November 2015</u>

- Currently educators must pay for licenses through the mail by check;
- Cumbersome process opening mail, staff handling nearly \$5 million in fees per biennium by hand.
- New online application system:
 - Apply for license online;
 - Pay for license online;
 - Check status of license application online;
 - Eliminates need for manual processing.

Online Application System



- Developed through NIC Systems under the umbrella of the DAS contract;
- NIC has developed a similar system for the Hawaii professional educator standards board;
- <u>Operation of new system will be paid for by \$10</u> <u>technology fee on licensure application</u>;
- Plan to have first phase operating in fall 2015.



Fee Increase POP 101

TSPC Revenue



- TSPC is funded solely by licensure fees
- The current fee for initial and renewal of licenses is \$100 per three or five year license ~ \$33 or \$20 per year respectively
- The \$100 fee has been in place for 10 years it was last raised from \$75 in 2005
- Still among the smallest licensure fees in the state

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Policy Package 105:

Email & Phone Response Times



Maintain Email Response Time and Decreased Phone Wait-Time

Add I.0 FTE Public Service Representative (Limited Duration);

- Will accomplish:
 - Reduce dropped phone calls
 - Reduce phone wait times
 - Sustain email response times (within 3 days)
 - Decrease walk-in wait times with full front desk coverage
 - Allow for Front Desk, Phone and Email coverage on Saturday mornings during the Summer (busiest season for agency)

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Policy Package 105: Licensure Backlog



Issue license within 20 days of receiving application by end of 2015-2017 biennium

Add I.0 FTE Administrative Specialist 2 –Issues Licenses (Limited Duration)

- Will Accomplish:
 - Issue more licenses per month
 - Decrease license processing time significantly
 - Improve services to school districts (phone responsiveness to questions)

Policy Package 104: Program Approval Compliance



- Add I.0 FTE Compliance Specialist 2; (permanent)
 - Will Accomplish:
 - Create preparation program Statewide Effectiveness Report Card
 - Implement edTPA (new teacher performance assessment)
 - Comply with proposed new federal accountability rules
 - Align with national standards for educator preparation
 - Implement regular employer and candidate satisfaction surveys
 - Provide timely site visit report summaries to Commission
 - Technical assistance for assessments and data literacy to preparation programs

Policy Package 104: Program Approval Compliance

- Will Accomplish (continued):
 - Technical assistance to support recruitment of more diverse candidates
 - Provide ongoing current data and data analysis to universities for program improvement
 - Update administrator preparation standards
 - Review integration of educator ethics into educator preparation programs
 - Provide ongoing peer-review training for site visits and review of educator preparation programs
 - Update web information related to preparation

Increase number of investigations completed per year

Add I.0 FTE Investigator 2 (Limited Duration)

- Will Accomplish
 - Complete more investigations
 - Reduce average time from complaint to completed investigation
 - Strive to meet KPM of 6 month average turnaround for investigations (current average is 12 months)

Policy Package 102: Professional Practices Staff



Increase Investigator Efficiency and Reduce Storage Rates Add I.0 FTE Office Assistant 2 (Limited Duration)

- Will Accomplish
 - Eliminate paper investigation files
 - Improve access to discipline documentation
 - Eliminate need for extra storage
 - (State retention requires 25 years for discipline cases)
 - Security Issues

 - Assist with updating web content
 - Assist with policy development for Commission

HB 2411- Overview



• Licensure Simplification (Abolish current outdated licenses)

Increases Statutory Fee Cap

- Current: \$100
- Proposed: \$350

Proposed Name Change

Professional Educator Standards Board

HB 2411



Allows Commission to Move to One Licensure System:

- Two Distinct Concurrent Licensure Systems:
- Licenses issued from 1965-1999:
 - Basic; Standard.
- Licenses issued from 1999 to present:
 - Initial; Continuing.
- Licensure Redesign Committee has been meeting since October 2012 to develop new tiered licensure structure.

 - Distinguished (Created by 2013 Legislature)

 - Redesign personnel license system
