WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Abolishes unfunded higher education loan, scholarship and grant programs. Combines fund accounts for alternative student loan program, scholarships for foster youth, and Nursing Services Program to allow for consolidated accounting. Separates statutes regarding scholarships for foster youth and scholarships for dependent children of deceased and disabled public safety officers. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

• Status of Grants with the Oregon Student Assistance Commission pertaining to the bill

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

Removes specific requirements that current or former foster children must meet in order to be awarded a scholarship by the HECC. The amendment also removes language regarding award amounts and inserts language permitting the HECC to determine the award amounts based on funds that are made available for the award year.

BACKGROUND:

A number of old, defunct and unfunded scholarship and grant programs exist in statutes under the auspices of the Office of Student Access and Completion (OSAC). House Bill 2409 abolishes those programs. Additionally, the measure combines the accounts of several funded programs in order to consolidate accounting procedures.

OSAC administers two scholarship programs governed by one statute: One for dependent children of public safety officers killed or disabled in the line of duty and one for former foster youth. House Bill 2409 separates this statute into two to eliminate confusion between these programs.
