HB 3494-A OPPOSE UNLESS AMENDED - Sen. Comm. on Human Services & Early Childhood June 2, 2015

To those representing Oregonians and their pets,

I oppose the current version HB3494-A, which has one inexcusable flaw in that it does not completely ban the inhumane act of declawing and debarking. It should be amended to ban all declawing and debarking.

In this modern millennium we condemn the cutting out of tongues for "false" speech, and severing of fingers and hands to punish thieves. That we view such punishments for crimes against humanity as inhumane, why then should we allow such violence against creatures we have breed to be dependent on us.
