Oregon's health care transformation is well underway, guided by the Oregon Health Authority and by our sixteen Coordinated Care Organizations (CCOs). The program tests the hypothesis that it is possible to change the way health care is delivered in Oregon such that the cost curve is modified, the quality of health care improved and access to effective health care is assured.

I believe it is the proper time for the House Health Care Committee to do a mid-course assessment on how this experiment is functioning, in order to determine the likelihood that the movement will succeed. Consequently we will be investing four of our committee meetings for a targeted report from each CCO. We have blocked out 25-minute slots during our afternoon sessions for the CEO of each of the sixteen CCOs to present a report on their progress to date. XXX CCO is scheduled for **Certain Day, Certain date at Specified time PM** in Hearing Room E.

I request that the CEO of each CCO do a *solo*, tightly structured, presentation.

The format for the presentation:

1. Describe your CCO structure, including the governance structure, the key partners, who bears the risk, the nature of the delivery system, the role of the community advisory council, and your profitability (5 minutes)
2. Describe what you are doing that will *fundamentally* change the way health care is delivered and financed in your community and specifically how this progress will be measured and when will results be broadly evident (5 minutes)
3. Describe specific efforts underway that integrate physical, mental and behavioral health (5 minutes)
4. Identify the three (3) quality measures on which your CCO recorded the worst performance and describe what actions have been implemented to improve performance in those areas (5 minutes)
5. Committee questions (5 – 10 minutes)

I recognize that this represents a significant time challenge for the presentation. Therefore we would appreciate it if you submit a more detailed report to the committee 48 hours in advance of your presentation. That will allow the members an opportunity to familiarize themselves with your organization.
