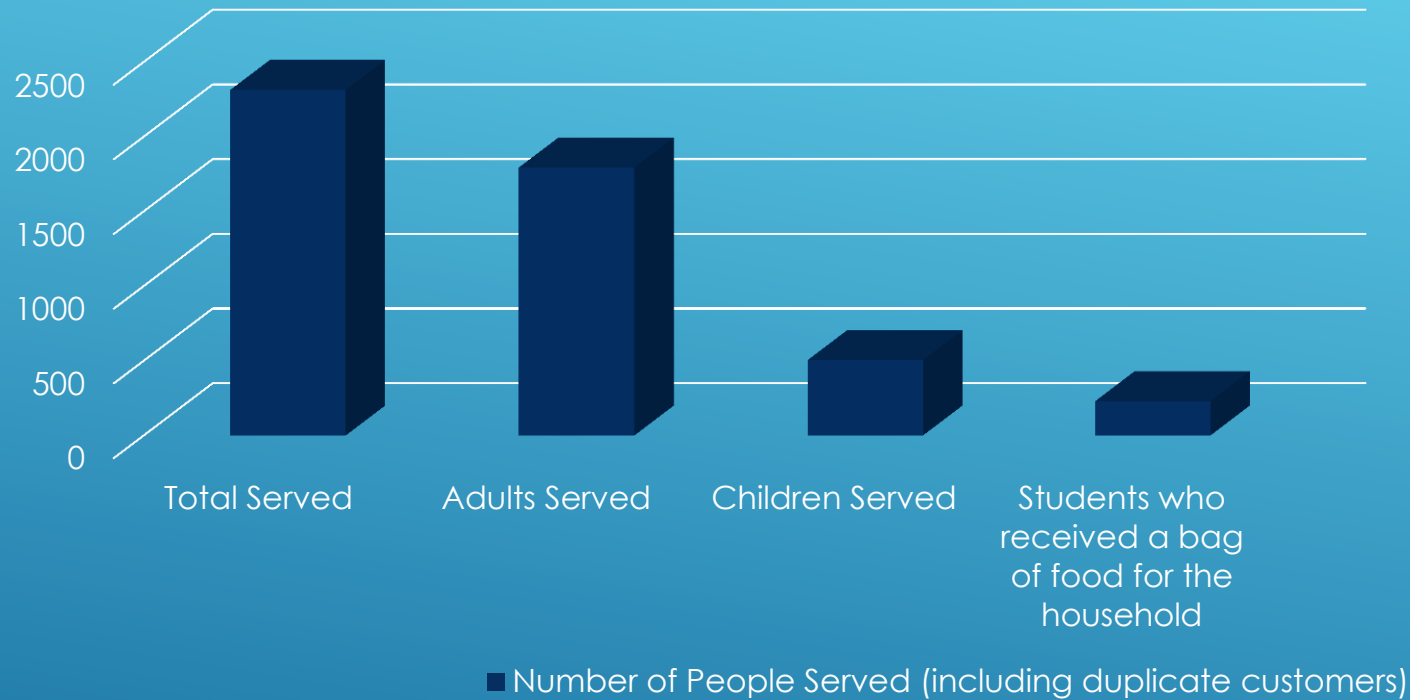

- ▶ March 2013 the sustainable food committee surveyed LCC students and revealed a high need for a food pantry on campus.
- ▶ Student continued to organize to address food insecurity with a food pantry
- ▶ May 6th, 2014 – LCC BOE approves establishment of Rainy Day Food Pantry
- ▶ Rainy Day Food Pantry Opens summer 2014th and services over 600 students its first few months

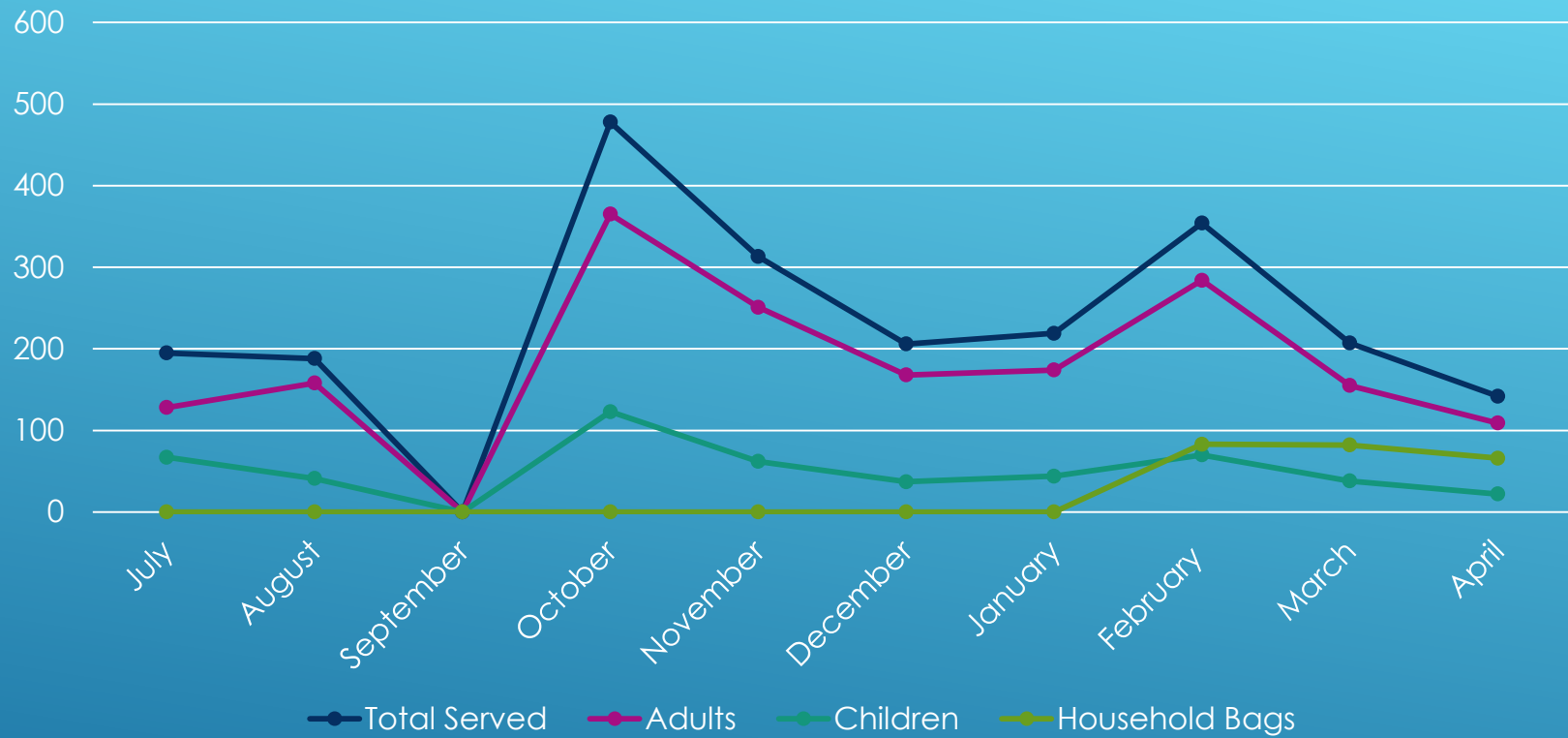
HISTORY OF THE RAINY DAY PANTRY

Number of People Served (including duplicate customers)

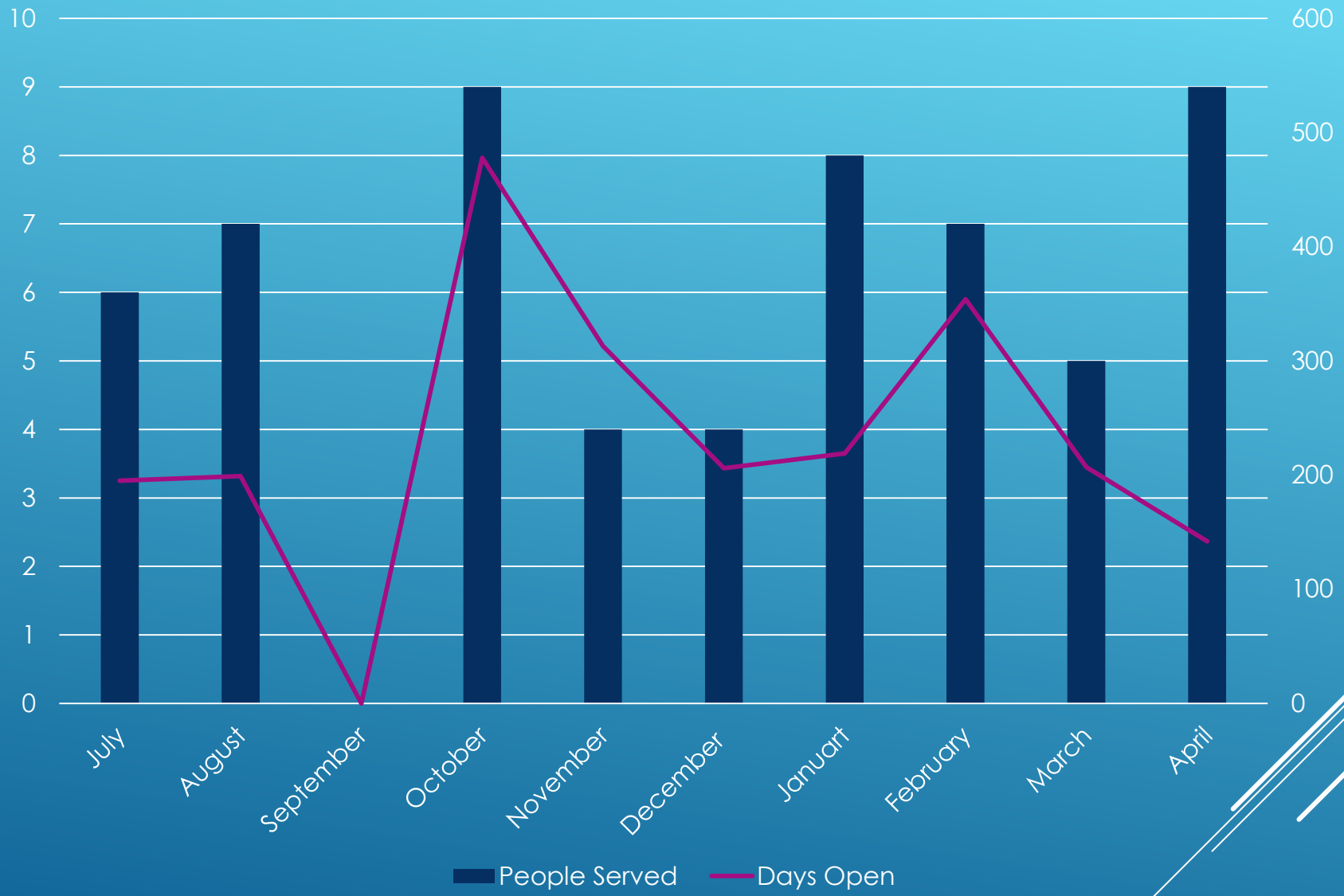


TOTAL SERVICE JULY 2014-APRIL 2015

MONTH BY MONTH USAGE



- ▶ Lane Community College Foundation have provided a \$10,000 grant to stabilize operations to address needs identified by student leaders
- ▶ LCC students passed a \$1.70 student fee increase in May, 2015 some of which is meant to support staffing
- ▶ Three work study position have been added
- ▶ Food for lane county gives regular donations and supports the student run initiative
- ▶ ASLCC fundraising service gives \$150/week to go shopping to supplement stock the food pantry.
