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HB 2680-A: A Better Way on Student Assessments

Oregon teachers spend too much time teaching to the test. Oregon students lose valuable instruction time to preparation for and administration of the high-stakes "Smarter Balanced" statewide assessment instead of practicing creative thinking and problem solving that will prepare them for college and career.

HB 2680-A will put Oregon on a new path, allowing education professionals to create a new system of assessments that supports student learning.

Temporary reprieve from the use of high-stakes assessment results

HB 2680-A will prohibit the use of data from statewide assessments administered during the 2014-2015 school year. The data will not be used to evaluate teachers, administrators, or schools during that time period.

Design a new system of assessment that supports student learning

HB 2680 directs the Oregon Superintendent of Public Instruction to convene a work group to review the current system of assessment and determine a better approach.

The work group will:

- 1. Review the results of the assessment administered during the 2014-2015 school year
- 2. Evaluate whether the assessment accurately measures student learning
- 3. Analyze student learning gaps
- 4. Identify adjustments in instruction necessary to address student learning gaps
- 5. Issue findings and make recommendations for legislation in a report submitted to the State Board of Education and to the interim House and Senate education committees
