BACKGROUND:

Privilege taxes for the harvest of forest products are assessed and fund forest management, fire suppression, forest research and experimentation, and administration and enforcement of the Oregon Forest Practices Act. The rates of privilege taxes are set by the Legislature every two years.

House Bill 2455 would extend the privilege taxes on merchantable forest products for calendar years beginning January 1, 2016 and January 1, 2017.
