Measure Description:

Provides for annual adjustment of judges' salaries based on Consumer Price Index.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Judicial Department, Legislative Assembly

Summary of Expenditure Impact: See Analysis

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

The measure would allow for the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court to adjust the salaries of judges based on the percentage increase from the previous calendar year of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the Portland-Salem area as published by the Bureau of Labor and Industries. The adjusted salaries would become effective July 1 of the year in which the adjustment is made. The first change to judges' salaries would be made July 1, 2016.

The fiscal impact is indeterminate because the first potential salary adjustment would be made on July 1, 2016 based on the CPI for 2015, which has yet to be determined. In order to estimate the potential impact, Oregon Judicial Department (OJD) used the 10-year average of CPI increases for the Portland-Salem area from 2004 to 2014. This 10-year average growth is 2.36%.

Using this 10-year average estimate, and assuming no change to the current number of judges, the potential increase to OJD in the 2015-17 biennium would be \$748,831 General Fund and \$3,066,454 General Fund in 2017-19.
