### WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Establishes Oregon Student Information Protection Act. Prohibits operators of Internet websites, online services, online applications or mobile applications from knowingly engaging in specified activities with regard to services or applications for kindergarten through grade 12 school purposes. Establishes operator responsibilities. Defines terms. Takes effect July 1, 2016.

## **BACKGROUND:**

Senate Bill 1177 (2014) of California prohibits an operator of an Internet Website, online service, online application, or mobile application from knowingly engaging in targeted advertising to students or their parents or legal guardians, using covered information to amass a profile about a kindergarten to grade 12 (k-12) student, selling a student's information or disclosing covered information. The bill will become operative January 1, 2016.

Senate Bill 187-A draws on Californian legislation, establishing the Oregon Student Information Protection Act and prohibiting operators of Internet websites, online services, online applications or mobile applications from knowingly engaging in specified activities with regard to services or applications for kindergarten through grade 12 school purposes.
